





Stars of Texas Juried Art Exhibit of **Brownwood Show Slated Feb. 8 to 20**

The Stars of Texas Juried Art Exhibit of Brownwood is announcing its call for entries for the eleventh annual juried art exhibit. The exhibit is scheduled for February 8, 2009 through February 20, 2009 to be held at the Depot Civic and Cultural Center, 600 Depot Street, Brownwood, Texas. The title for this year's show is Let Your Heart Flow.

Every year the exhibition continues to grow and expand. 




