## Order Restricting Outdoor Burning In Unincorporated Areas Of County

COUNTY OF EASTLAND

ORDER RESTRICTING OUTDOOR BURNING

WHEREAS, The Commissioners Court has determined that circumstances present in all or part of the unincorporated area of the county create a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burn-

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED by the Commissioners Court of Eastland County that all outdoor burning is banned in the unincorporated area of the county for 90 days from the date of adoption of this order, beginning February 9, 2009 and ending May 10, 2009, unless the restrictions are terminated earlier based on a determination made by the Texas Forest Service or this Court. This Order is adopted pursuant to Local Government Code 352.081, and other applicable statutes. This order does not prohibit outdoor burning activities related to public health and safety that are authorized by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality for (1) firefighter training; (2) public utility, natural gas pipeline or mining operations; or (3) planting or harvesting of agricultural crops; or (4) burns that are conducted by a prescribed burn manage certified under Section 153.048, Natural Resources Code, and meet the standards of Section 153.047, Natural Resources Code.

In accordance with Local Government Code 352.081, a violation of this Order is a Class C Misde-

meanor, punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500.00 Adopted this 9th day of February, 2009, by a vote of 5 Ayes and 0 nays.



### USDA Sets Date for Lamb Referendum

WASHINGTON, Dec 12, 2008 -- The U.S. Department of Agriculture today announced that it will offer lamb producers, feeders, and first handlers the opportunity to vote in a nationwide referendum on whether to continue or terminate the Lamb Promotion, Research, and Information Order, authorized under the Commodity Promotion, Research, and Information Act of 1996. The referendum will be held Feb. 2-27, 2009.

The referendum will be conducted at USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA) county offices. To be eligible to vote, persons must certify and provide documentation, such as a sales receipt or remittance form, which shows they have been engaged in the production, feeding, or slaughtering of lambs during the period, Jan. 1, 2008, through Dec. 31, 2008.

Beginning Feb. 2, 2009, and continuing through Feb. 27, 2009, persons eligible to vote should obtain form LS-86 from a county FSA office either in person, by mail, fax, or via the Internet at: http:// www.ams.usda.gov/lsmarketingprograms. Persons must vote in the referendum at the County FSA office where their administrative farm records are maintained. For those persons not participating in FSA prorams, the opportunity to vote will be provided at the County FSA office where the person owns or rents

Form LS-86 and supporting documentation must be returned in person, by mail, or by fax to the appropriate county FSA office. The form and documentation returned in person or by fax must be received in the appropriate county office prior to the close of business on Feb. 27, 2009. The form and documentation returned by mail must be postmarked no later than midnight on Feb. 27, 2009, and received in the county FSA office by March 6, 2009.

USDA monitors activities of the American Lamb Board. The mandatory program is financed by producers, seedstock producers (breeders), feeders, and exporters who are assessed one-half cent (\$.005) per pound when live ovine animals are sold. The first handler, primarily packers, pays an additional 30 cents per head on ovine animals purchased for slaughter.

It is Monday morning and I a wondering where the rain went. We got less than a quarter of an inch and dust is in the forecast this afternoon. It seems a little ironic, don't you think? Pray for rain! If you've been praying, keep it up. If you haven't been, start! We are dangerously dry out there. If you smoke, please be careful and don't throw your lit cigarettes out of the car window. Better yet, quit smoking!

Last Tuesday I visited the capitol in connection with Gorman's Economic Development Corporation that is a member of the Texas Midwest Community Network (TMCN). I, along with Cliffa Vaughn, Robert Erwin, and Joe Casey represented Gorman and we spoke with Jim Keffer, our state representative, and with Troy Frasier, our state senator, about the concerns and needs of rural Texas west of I-35. We were well received and I appreciate Representative Keffer and Senator Frasier for the time they spent with us individually and the group of over 130 as a whole. Officially, we were all there for "Texas Midwest Day at the Capitol".

This week will end our basketball season. The junior high finished up last week. It will be just boys playing in Deleon this Friday night. Although our varsity teams lost Friday night here against Meridian, our teams played their very best. We have just been in an extremely hard district, especially when the majority of the schools we play have almost twice as many students from which to choose. I expect that we will be more competitive in baseball and softball.

I have given several tours through the building project and one of the comments that was made recently was that they did not think that most people in town realized what a great project this was and that it was not just a gym, but a new high school that will house state of the art science, computer and drama labs and classrooms. This is a facility that will last. It will be here as long as the old two story and attract new students and families to Gorman. Two of the three sets of steps were poured last week and we are setting windows as well. If you have not been by lately, you should at least drive by and see the progress. We hope to finish by the end of June and we will have an open house when it's finished. Remember, this is your school!

Don't forget our scoreboard fund raiser. We will be sending out a letter to all tax payers and vendors with whom the District does business soon. Until then, if you wish to make a donation, please come by my office or mail it in. It is tax deductible.

The India Children's Choir that was to perform at Maxfield Elementary on Thursday, February 19th has been canceled. They have been detained in India due to a problem with their visas. We hope they will be able to be here at a later date next year. We will let everyone know when we find out.

We held our regularly scheduled school board meeting Monday evening. The meeting began promptly at 6:00pm with a prayer by Jeff Seaton and then the Pledge of Allegiance. The board then reviewed the consent agenda and unanimously approved payment of the bills, payment of payroll, and an amendment to the budget (not additional money just moving it from one area to another). Tim Barton then gave his report on the construction project indicating that we were on schedule and all was going well. He reviewed the timeline, the latest work that had been done and the work to be completed in the near future.

This Friday is the end of the fourth six weeks. Report cards will be sent out next Wednesday. If your child is failing any subject or close to failing, please call their teacher and schedule a conference to see how you might be able to help your child improve their performance. It takes team work between teachers and parents to insure a child's success. Mr. Perry then reported the just over 85% of 2008 M & O and I & S taxes had been collected; that GISD's fund balance was \$2,857,496.64; and EastEnd Special Education Coop's fund balance was \$1,151,402.33. Mr. Perry said that we were in excellent financial condition. Reports were then received from Coach Hendrix, Mrs. Hampton, Mrs. Reeves, and Mr. Panter. The highlights of those reports were that baseball and softball practices had begun. Our enrollment is holding at 386 right now and our attendance has dropped just a little due to illness. Mr. Perry then reported several information items: a picture of our electronic sign is being used by the sign company on the front of their sales brochure; we are a part of the RUS III Grant being applied for by the Region 14 ESC; discussed legislation that might affect us at the state and federal level; discussed the color schemes to be used in the new gymnasium; Discussed financial commitments already made toward the purchase of our four sided scoreboard. The board then authorized Mr. Perry to continue to negotiate with the different scoreboard companies for the best price for a scoreboard that will meet our desires and then make the purchase. There has been excellent response so far regarding donations/gifts for the purchase of the scoreboard which is estimated to have a total installed cost of around \$25,000.00 and it is believed that we will receive at least that much in donations if not more which will help use with other items needed in the gym. The board then unanimously approved calling for a trustee election on May 9, 2009, approved the amendment of our joint election agreement with the city, and authorized Mr. Perry to make application to TEA for a separate campus number for a middle school campus to be established next year in what is now the high school and to move sixth grade to the new campus. The board then discussed personnel needs of the district.
