## Order Restricting Outdoor Burning

 In Unincorporated Areas Of County
## COUNTY OF EASTL

ORDER RESTRICTING OUTDOOR BURNING
WHEREAS, The Commissioners Court has determined that circumstances present in all or part of he unincorporated area of the county create a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burn-

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED by the Commissioners Court of Eastland County that all outdoor burning is banned in the unincorporated area of the county for 90 days from the date of adoption of this order
beginning February 9,2009 and ending May 10,2009 unless the restrictions are terminated earlier based on beginning February 9,2009 and ending May 10,2009 , unless the restrictions are terminated earlier based on a
determination made by the Texas Forest Service or this Court. This Order is adopted pursuant to Local Government Code 352.081, and other applicable statutes. This order does not prohibit outdoor burning activities elated to public health and safety that are authorized by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality for 1) firefighter training; (2) public utility, natural gas pipeline or mining operations; or (3) planting or harvesting of agricultural crops; or (4) burns that are conducted by a prescribed burn manage certified under Section 153.048 , Natural Resources Code, and meet the standards of Section 153.047, Natural Resources Code In accordance with Local Government Code 352.081, a violation of this Order is a Class C Misd Adopted this 9th day of February, 2009, by
