Thanks to everyone who attended the dance last Friday night - we had a great time! We had a stand-in singer for Johnny Johnson and he was very good.



### **Notes From** Dr. Dan

Bubba and Boudreaux were camping when a snake bit Bubba when he was peeing. You know where he got bit unfortunately. Boudreaux called 911 and asked them what to do. They said to cut 2 small holes over the puncture marks from the snake fangs and suck the poison out with your mouth but be sure not to swallow the poison. After the call, Bubba asked Boudreaux what they said. Boudreaux said: "They said you're gonna die".

DO NOT CUT PEOPLE UP IF THEY GET SNAKE BIT!!! DO NOT SHOCK THEM WITH BAT-TERIES EITHER! It used to be common practice to do the above procedures, but we also used to commonly use leeches and bloodletting and even surgery for ulcers instead of antibiotic therapy like we do now.

The best tool for treatment of snakebite in the field is a set of keys to a vehicle that can get you to the emergency room quickly and safely. We now have antivenom at our local rural hospitals and if needed we have helicopters to get you to the nearest ICU. By the way, the common medicine for Copperhead bites is benadryl.

Keep the patient as calm as possible so that the poison does not circulate around the body quickly. Do not put a tourniquet on the patient but keep the bitten part of the body lower than the rest. A tourniquet can make it necessary to amputate a body part later and when a tourniquet is removed, the surge of venom in that part of the body may put the patient into shock.

**IDENTIFY** THE SNAKE IF AT ALL POSSIBLE BUT DON'T GET BIT AGAIN CATCHING OR KILLING THE SNAKE. Poisonous snakes in North America can be distinguished by their heads, but dead snake heads can bite you due to their primitive nervous system. Don't get bit by a dead snake.

Remember, prevention is better than a doctor visit. Be careful.




