

Local Paramedic Named to State Injury Prevention Committee

During the 2010 Texas EMS Conference & Governor's EMS & Trauma Advisory Council's meeting which was held in Austin during the week of Thanksgiving, Tim Dennis, a local paramedic, EMS Educator and Child Passenger Safety Technician was reappointed to the Governor's EMS & Trauma Advisory Council's, Injury Prevention Committee for another 3 yr term. Tim, was first appointed to this statewide committee back in November 2007.

This state committee looks at various injury prevention programs as well as evidence based strategies for injury Prevention in Texas. During the November meeting, the committee looked at Red-Light Cameras as Injury Prevention tools, Programs that deal with preventing falls in the elderly, and DWI checkpoints. This committee also supported the Booster Seat Law that took effect this year. Several of the committee members ere a part of the Coalition that helped get the new law passed. 




