Notes From Dr. Dan
Have you ever heard of a Lepigator? One end is the head of a Leopard and the other is the head of an alligator. I' sthe most ferocious animal in the world! You may be wondering
how it goes to the bathroom. It doesn't. That's why its so feroucious!! how it goes to the bathroom. It doesn 't. That's why its so feroucious!!
If you have ever had kidney stones, you will know what it feels like to be a Lepigator. It is more painful than having a baby... so I've heard... over and over.
The stones are made of salts that are filtered out by the kidney, and if they get concentrated, they will become sharp stones in your plumbing. A real good thing in this case is to
prevent becoming a Lepigator in the first place by drinking lots of water. If its too late for that, there are some things we can do but....well it will still probably hurt quite a bit. pain medicine which can cause other problems. There is also a procedure called lithotripsy which is using sound waves to break up the stones into gravel. I think I like the prevention better. It's good to drink water. If you do get a kidney stone, or as doctors call it renal lithiasis, it would be a good idea to filter your urine to catch the stone when it comes out. You can use several layers of cheese cloth for a filter or get a special filter from the pharmacy. We could then find out what the stone was made of and be better able to prevent another stone from oc-
curring. If you get too many stones they may damage your kidney or ureturs [your pumbing Best thing is to....as Sondra, my wife, always tells me, drink plenty of water and don't become a Lepigator.
