Forms must be completed and are to be received in Iowa City, Iowa, no later than September 20, 1996. Students who are currently enrolled in Gorman High School do not need to register for this test.
Persons who have not finished high school and who are interested in obtaining their diplomas, must fulfill the requirments for graduation that were in effect when their class graduated. Therefore if the TAAS was not required for a person's class it would not
