### **Mary Powell Receives Degree from McMurry University**

Mary Powell of Gorman, TX, has been awarded a Bachelor of Science degree in All Level Physical Education from the School of Education at McMurry University. Powell is one of 79 graduates receiving degrees during the Commencement in Radford Auditorium on Saturday, Dec. 17.

Offering a diverse academic curriculum to more than 1,400 students, McMurry University is a small Christian liberal arts school in Abilene. Students choose from 41 majors; education and business are popular as are the school's pre-professional programs in medicine, dentistry, law, and physical therapy. The three-week May Term gives students an opportunity to explore a subject outside their major. Through the Servant Leadership Program, students learn about ethics and develop leadership qualities. McMurry's signature Texas Semester takes students through Texas history and culture with hands-on experiences like visits from leading authorities that take place both in the classroom and at historical sites across the state. Internships with businesses in Abilene present undergradu-

ates with the opportunity to acquire additional knowledge of the workplace in nonprofit and corporate settings. The Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) have approved McMurry University to grant master's degrees. Beginning in the fall of 2012, students may enroll in a Master of Nursing program through the Patty Hanks Shelton School of Nursing. It is anticipated that a second master's program in Education in Curriculum and Instruction with an English as a Second Language Endorsement (ESL) will be launched in the fall of 2013 through the School of Education.

This past summer, the NCAA officially announced that McMurry University has been accepted into a NCAA Division II candidacy period, bringing back scholarship athletics to the institution for the first time since the 1976-77 school year.

### NRCS Announces Sign-up Period for Conservation Stewardship Program

TEMPLE, Texas, - USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) State Conservationist Salvador Salinas announced Jan. 13, 2012 as the first ranking cut-off period for the Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP).

"CSP gives conservation minded producers the ability to apply and build on their current stewardship efforts," said Salinas. "Farmers and ranchers actively engaged in natural resource conservation practices have the opportunity to earn financial rewards through CSP."

CSP is a voluntary five-year program offered to landowners statewide through continuous signup. Producers interested in CSP should submit applications to their local NRCS office by the deadline so their applications can be considered during this first 2012 ranking period.

In fiscal year 2011, Texas awarded 206 CSP contracts on nearly 500,000 acres with a total of \$5.1 million in payments to help farmers and ranchers implement conservation practices that provide public benefits, such as cleaner water and improved air qual-

"CSP is a strong program in Texas and we are hopeful more farmers and ranchers with stewardship goals will participate in the 2012 CSP," said Salinas.


Eligible lands include cropland, pastureland, rangeland and nonindustrial forestland and agricultural land under the jurisdiction of Indian tribes. Individual landowners, legal entities and Indian tribes may be eligible to apply for CSP assistance. Participants will have the opportunity to receive payments for practices that maintain and improve water and soil quality, as well as enhance wildlife habitat.

A CSP self-screening checklist is available to help potential applicants determine if CSP is suitable for their operation. The checklist highlights basic information about CSP eligibility requirements, contract obligations and potential payments. It is available from local NRCS offices and on the CSP Web page.

As part of the CSP application process, applicants will work with 2222. NRCS field personnel to complete a resource inventory using a Conservation Measurement Tool (CMT), which determines the conservation performance for existing and new conservation activities. The applicant's conservation performance will be used to determine eligibility, ranking and payments.

"I encourage farmers and ranchers actively involved in conserving their natural resources to apply for CSP in order to maintain or improve existing conservation activities, and implement additional practices on their land," said Salinas.

The President hopes to end the war in Afghanistan in 2014, but leading Republican candidates are hope we can get one started in Iran soon after Christmas or at least by the 2012 election in November.

I plan to go to church Sunday morning because Christmas is coming and I would like to find out if anybody is singing 'Peach on Earth, Good Will to Men.'

COLLEGE STATION, Texas - As many as 500 million trees scattered across the Lone Star State have died this year as a result of the unrelenting drought, according to preliminary estimates from Texas Forest Service.

The numbers were derived by Texas Forest Service foresters, who canvassed local forestry professionals, gathering information from them on the drought and its effect on trees in their

respective communities. Each forestry expert estimated the percentage of trees in their region that have died as a result of the 2011 drought. That percentage was applied to the estimated number of trees in the region, a figure determined by the agency's Forest Inventory & Analysis (FIA) program.

Using this approach, an estimated 100 million to 500 million trees with a diameter of 5 inches or larger were estimated to have succumbed to the drought. That range is equivalent to 2

to 10 percent of the state's 4.9 billion trees. "In 2011, Texas experienced an exceptional drought, prolonged high winds and record-setting temperatures. Together, those conditions took a severe toll on trees across the state," said Burl Carraway, Sustainable Forestry department head. "Large numbers of trees in both urban communities and rural forests have died or are struggling to survive. The impacts are numerous and

widespread." The preliminary estimates indicate three multi-county areas appear to be the hardest hit. The area including Sutton, Crockett, western Kimble and eastern Pecos counties saw extensive

mortality among Ashe junipers. The area including Harris, Montgomery, Grimes, Madison and Leon counties saw extensive mortality among loblolly pines. Western Bastrop and eastern Caldwell counties, as well as surrounding areas, saw extensive mortality among cedars and post oaks.

Additionally, localized pockets of heavy mortality were reported for many other areas.

Texas Forest Service foresters plan to use aerial imagery to conduct a more in-depth analysis in the spring, which is when trees that may have gone into early dormancy — an act of self-preservation — could begin to make a comeback.

A more scientific, long-term study will be completed as the agency collects data through its FIA program. Considered a census for trees, the federally-funded program allows the agency to keep a close watch on trees - and how they're growing and changing - across the state.

"Quantifying the impacts of a statewide drought on tree survival is no small task," Carraway said, noting that Texas was home to 63 million acres of forestland, much of which is in remote areas.

"During this time of year, it's difficult to tell in some cases if a tree is truly dead. And keep in mind that the drought is ongoing. We fully expect mortality percentages to increase if the drought continues."

Holidays Season is a lonely time for the sick and shut-ins. Take time out of your busy schedule to remember those in our community with your cards and prayers.



### Protecting the B-1 Bomber

Earlier this year, President Obama included a plan in his budget to retire six B-1 bombers in 2012. I am, and continue to be, concerned about the impact of this proposal not just on Dyess Air Force Base, but also on the B-1 bomber fleet and our national security as a whole. Our next generation long-range bomber is at least a decade from rolling off of the production line. Until then, we need to protect and preserve the assets we have.

The National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA), which passed the House and the Senate last week, included language I initiated regarding the B-1. While the legislation allows for some B-1 retirements, it reduces the initial number from the proposed six to only three. In addition, these retirements will come from the training aircraft, not the combat fleet. Over the next five years, three additional planes may be retired. Also, the Air Force must outline for Congress a long-term plan for the B-1 by outlining how any savings will be spent, and most importantly, how they plan to maintain the rest of the fleet for the next ten years. This is a significant improvement over the President's plan because it gives the Air Force and Congress the chance to carefully evaluate the impact of reducing our bomber fleet before the next generation bomber comes online.

While I have grave concerns regarding the impact of retiring even a single B-1, in this fiscal environment all options are on the table. I will closely monitor this retirement process, and carefully evaluate the plan to keep the B-1 in the skies protecting our nation. I am proud to represent the men and women at Dyess Air Force Base, and this bill will allow the Dyess community to continue to play a vital role in keeping Americans safe.

### House Action on Payroll Tax Extension

Last week, the House passed the Middle Class Tax Relief and Job Creation Act. This bill would extend the payroll tax holidary and unemployment insurance for one year, as well as maintain payments for doctors who treat Medicare patients for two years. After negotiations between Senate Democrats and Senate Republicans, the Senate passed a bill that would extend these programs only until February.

If the Senate bill is signed into law, Congress will have to revisit the issue again in two months. The House is now considering a legislative conference of the two bills to work out the differences before the payroll tax holiday expires on December 31, 2011. At this point in time, the Senate is refusing to reconvene to find common ground.

NDAA Detainee Language

Regarding the National Defense Authorization Act, concerns have been raised about the right of the administration to detain U.S. citizens associated with terrorist groups. Last week, I addressed this issue on my website. To read more information on this and what I think about it, click here.


