

Routine Monitoring Violation Total Coliform Rule

City of Gorman, PWS 0670003, failed to collect the required number of bacteriological samples for coliform monitoring of the water distribution system during the month of February 2012. This monitoring is required by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality's "Drinking Water Standards" and the federal "Safe Drinking Water Act," Public Law 95-523.

Bacteriological samples are used to monitor water quality and indicate if the water is free of coliform bacteria. Our water system is required to submit two (2) bacteriological samples each month. Failure to collect all required bacteriological samples is a violation of the monitoring requirements and we are required to notify you of this violation.

To the Voters Of Gorman I.S.D.

First of all let me Thank You for the honor of representing you on the Board of Trustees for over 23 years. I served from 1978 to 1993, then from 2003 until the present time.

Today we face more problems as a School District than ever before. State Funding used to be our greatest asset, today if is our biggest enemy. We are faced with a legislature that doesn't want to fund the Public Schools as they should. We have a Governor that is all about personal glory and achievement. He could care less about the Public School of Texas, and the Children we are trying to educate. Teacher pay is still well below the national average.

Somehow, we have made it financially through this school year. The state didn't cut our funds as much as was expected. Governor Perry chose not to make the originally planned cuts in order to aid his short-lived run for the presidency of the United States. Through the grapevine we heard he told the legislature not to cut the Schools funding as band in 2011-12 and the State would make up for it by cutting the Schools more severely than originally planned in the 2012-2013 School year. If this happens we could see many small Schools in Texas have to close their doors and there is even rumor of a Statewide Teacher Strike. I hope you realize, Governor Perry is a very self-centered, disorganized person. This became very evident when the national media exposed how much of a "country bumpkin" he was in his "short-lived" run for the White House. It became very clear to the voters that he can't run his own state much less the United States of America.

Governor Perry and our State Legislature have so overburdened our Teachers and Students with mandated testing that our teachers have no time to teach the "three R's" but must teach the test material. The real kicker is that School Funding is tied to how well our students do on the State mandated tests. During the 3rd six weeks of the 2010-11 school year our Teachers were only able to teach school 18 days. The rest of the days in the six weeks were spent taking State mandated tests! We are losing many great teachers all across the State because of this problem.

Please contact your State Senators and Representatives and the Governor's office about the testing and the funding cuts that cost many teachers their jobs. We need your help to stop the cuts. Please ask them to stop the cuts and call a Special Session to restore the cuts to the schools. Budget cuts have already cost Texas 32,000 education jobs, including 12,000 teachers, and a total of 50,000 education jobs and 68,000 related private sector jobs could be lost by the end of the two year State Budget cycle. The cuts will force students to learn in thousands of overcrowded classrooms and harm the quality of their education. We can stop the cuts now. At least \$7.3 billion will remain in the State rainy day fund at the end of the current budget cycle. We, as teachers, school officials, and taxpayers need to urge our legislators and local elected officials to join in the Call to Stop the Cuts. The restoration of these cuts will result in no new taxes and still leave billions in the bank for other State priorities. Please help us Stop the Cuts on Education. We need your help!

Thank you for reading this lengthy letter. I respectfully ask for your vote in the School Trustee Election. Unlike my opponents, I have No Nepotism Issues. I have no family members employed by the School. I will serve impartially to the best of my ability the Gorman I.S.D.





USDA Crop Certification Deadline For Eastland County Is July 15, 2012

Eastland County USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) Executive Director John Bird reminds producers that the annual crop certification deadline for spring-seeded crops is July 15, 2012.

Producers who file accurate and timely reports for all crops and land uses, including failed acreage, can prevent the potential loss of FSA program benefits.

"I encourage all producers to visit the Eastland County FSA office to file an accurate crop certification report by the July 15 deadline in order to comply with FSA program eligibility requirements," said Bird.

Producers are also reminded to report crop losses insured through Federal

Crop Insurance and the Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP) within 15 days of the disaster or as soon as the loss is apparent.

Producers with interest in multiple counties should check the crop certification deadline for each county because there are three deadlines statewide.
