The Gorman Panthers hosted the Irion County Hornets and showed their defensive power. They scored in each of the final 3 quarters.

The Panther defense held the Hornets on their first possession and got the ball on their own 28 and had a long drive to the Hornet 12 before being stopped.

Gorman took advantage of a bad snap on a Hornet punt try and got the ball on the Hornet 5. After runs of -1 and 5 by B. J. Ramirez, Zach Carlton got the final yard on a keeper play with 9:35 left in the second period. Carlton added the point after and the Panthers were up 7-0. This score stood up through the first half.

Both the bands turned in fine performances during the intermission and the Panther Cheerleaders performed a very good routine. The Panther Marching Band, under the leadership of Lisa Laminack turned in another great job with a standing ovation from the fans.

Following the intermission the Panthers went right to work, taking the kickoff on the 50 yard line and scoring in 7 plays with Ramirez racing 30 yards for the score with 7:55 left in the third. Carlton added the point after and the score stood at 14-0. The drive featured a 9 yard run by Ramirez, runs of 4 and 9 by Dakota Pacheco, and runs of 5 and -2 by Carlton.

After holding the Hornets on their second possession of the half, the Panthers got a great defensive play from Carlton, who took an interception on the Gorman 40 yard line and returning it 60 yards for Gorman's final score to make the score 21-0 after Carlton's point after.

Ramirez led the Panthers with 82 yards on 12 carries. Pacheco had 45 on 6 tries. Rylan Laminack got 13 on 2 and Carlton had 3 on 8 tries and Sergio Garcia carried once for 1.

The Panthers get a week off this week before traveling to Cross Plains to open District Play on the 28th.


Weaver Cemetery Is In Need Of Help

A Letter To The Editor

Six Texas Firefighters Honored at National **Fallen Firefighters Memorial Service**

Gregory Mack Simmons to be Remembered October 6-7 at Official National Ceremonies in MD

EMMITSBURG, MD - The 31st Annual National Fallen Firefighters Memorial Service will honor seven Texas firefighters who died in the line of duty. They are among the 80 firefighters who died in 2011 and five firefighters who died in previous years who will be remembered at the official national service held at the National Fire Academy in Emmitsburg, Maryland on Sunday,

Firefighter Gaston A. Gagne III, age 46, of the Baytown Fire Department died within 24 hours after responding to several emergency calls on July 26, 2011 Lieutenant Todd W. Krodle, age 41, of the Dallas Fire-Rescue Department died from injuries sustained after falling through the roof at a residential structure fire on August 14, 2011. Firefighter Elias Macias-Jaquéz, age 49, of the Cactus Volunteer Fire Department died from burn injuries sustained while operating at a wildland fire on April 20, 2011. Lieutenant Larry G. Nelson, age 61, of the Val Verde County Rural Fire Department died after falling from a ladder while performing maintenance work at the station on August 12, 2011. Firefighte Chris K. Pham, age 35, of the Dallas Fire-Rescue Department was found unresponsive after responding to an emergency medical call and later died on June 23, 2011. Firefighter Gregory Mack Simmons, age 50, of the Eastland Fire Department died after being struck by a vehicle during a wildland fire on April 15, 2011.

The names of those firefighters who died in the line of duty will be added to the National Fallen Firefighters Memorial on the Academy grounds. The national tribute is sponsored by the National Fallen Firefighters Foundation (NFFF) and the Department of Homeland Security.

More than 6,000 people, including Members of Congress, Administration officials and other dignitaries, members of the fire service, and families and friends of the fallen firefighters will attend the event. Families will receive flags flown over the U. S. Capitol and the National Memorial. Members of the fire service, honor guard units and pipe and drum units from across the U.S. will participate in this national tribute.
