thers opened the season on Friday night when they traveled to Eldorado and came out on the short end of a 21-8 score. They trailed 9-0 the end of the initial quarter and 21-0 at the halftime intermission. Then came back in the last half to score 8 points while holding the Eagles scoreless.

Eldorado scored ont he opening drive, going 67 yards in just 2 plays with runs of 46 and 21 with Rico Martinez getting the final 21 yards on a run with 10:54 left. Hector Reyes booted the extra point to make it 7-0.

exchang-After ing possessions a couple of times the Eagles added a safety when the Panther runner was caught for a loss in the end zone to up the score

Then with 6:59 left in the half the Eagles scored on a 9 yard run by Dylan Ramos. The point after try was blocked and the score went to 15-0. The drive started on the Gorman 20 after an interception.

With 4:05 left in the second period the Eagles scored again on a 55 yard drive in just 3 plays with Rico Martinez going in for the score from 54 yards out. The try for points failed and the score was 21-0 at the halftime intermission.

The teams played on fairly even terms in the last half with some fumbles exchanges and turnovers.

With 10:02 left in the final period the Panthers took over the ball on the Eagle 45 and scored in 8 plays with Sergio Hipolito on a pass from Zach Carlton from 15 yards out. B. J. Ramirez ran for the 2 pointer to make the score 21-8. The drive covered 55 yards in 8 plays. Ramirez had 4 carries for 15 yards and caught a 21 yard pass from Carlton.

This was a hard fought game with the Panthers doing a good job on defense but was low in yards for offense. Ramirez had 58 on 18 carries. Matt Fox was 2 for 11 and Carlton wound up with -15 on 9 keepers or pass tries.






