



For Labor Ills By United Press. GENEVA-The gold standard con-

stitutes the best remedy for unemployment. This is the conclusion of the international labor bureau here after a world-wide study of the whole prob-lem of unemployment as it has ex-

isted ever since the close of the war. The investigation has demonstrated that employment and unemployment follow closely changes in the general price level. When the general price level goes up, unemployment de

These fluctuations of the general price level depend largely, the investigation demonstrated, on the stability of the currency of each counterprise of the general price of the general pr

In those countries, where the gold standard has either been maintained or restored, or where the govern-ments have been able to maintain their exchange with the American dollar, fluctuations in the general price level have been few and unemployment consequently smaller.

This law has been demonstrated especially in the United States, England, Germany, Austria, Hungary, Czecho-Slovakia and Russia. The only countries with a stable currency that presented exceptions are Holland Ireland and Canada, but

here other important factors altered the situation.

On the other hand countries like France, Italy, Denmark, Norway and Japan where the gold standard has not been maintained, have suffered heavily from a constant fluctuation of the general price level and resulting unemployment.


