





Livestock Industry Less Encouraging Than Few Months Ago

AUSTIN, Feb. 20.—"The livestock industry is a little less encouraging than it was a month ago," according to Bervard Nichols, editor of the Texas Business Review, published by the bureau of business research of the University of Texas. Mr. Nichols explains this condition as follows:

"The extended drouth in large areas of the state had a telling effect on the condition of both ranges and animals. Animals generally entered the winter in good flesh and they have wintered thus far with but little deterioration and scarcely any loss. Many producers have been forced to feed; this is especially true of breed-ing stock and young animals. There is more feeding this year than last."

The rains of the last three weeks. The rams of the last three weeks, however, have been quite general and the prevailing higher temperatures have stimulated growth of weeds and grass, Mr. Nichols has noted. "More moisture is needed in many districts order to insure better ranges for the rest of the winter and early spring. However, ample hay and other feeds are available for all requirements, and there is little cause for apprehension about the outcome of the winter. Hay and feed prices are advancing." are advancing

Range Conditions. The report given by the department of agriculture on Feb. 1 places the cattle ranges in Texas at 78 per cent normal which compares with 82 per cent and 88 per cent for December and January of a year ago, according to Mr. Nichols. "Cattle deteriorated five points to 80 per cent

cent, the same as last month, compared to 91 per cent on Feb. 1, 1927. Goats were rated at 88 per cent cent against 87 per cent last month and 92 per cent a year ago. Sheep and goats have wintered very well up to the present time. Losses have been negligible. The lamb and kid crops are expected to be large this spring.
Wool and mohair prices advanced.
Several large clips of wool sold for 42 cents to 43 cents a pound, or about 5 cents a pound above last year's sales at this time.
