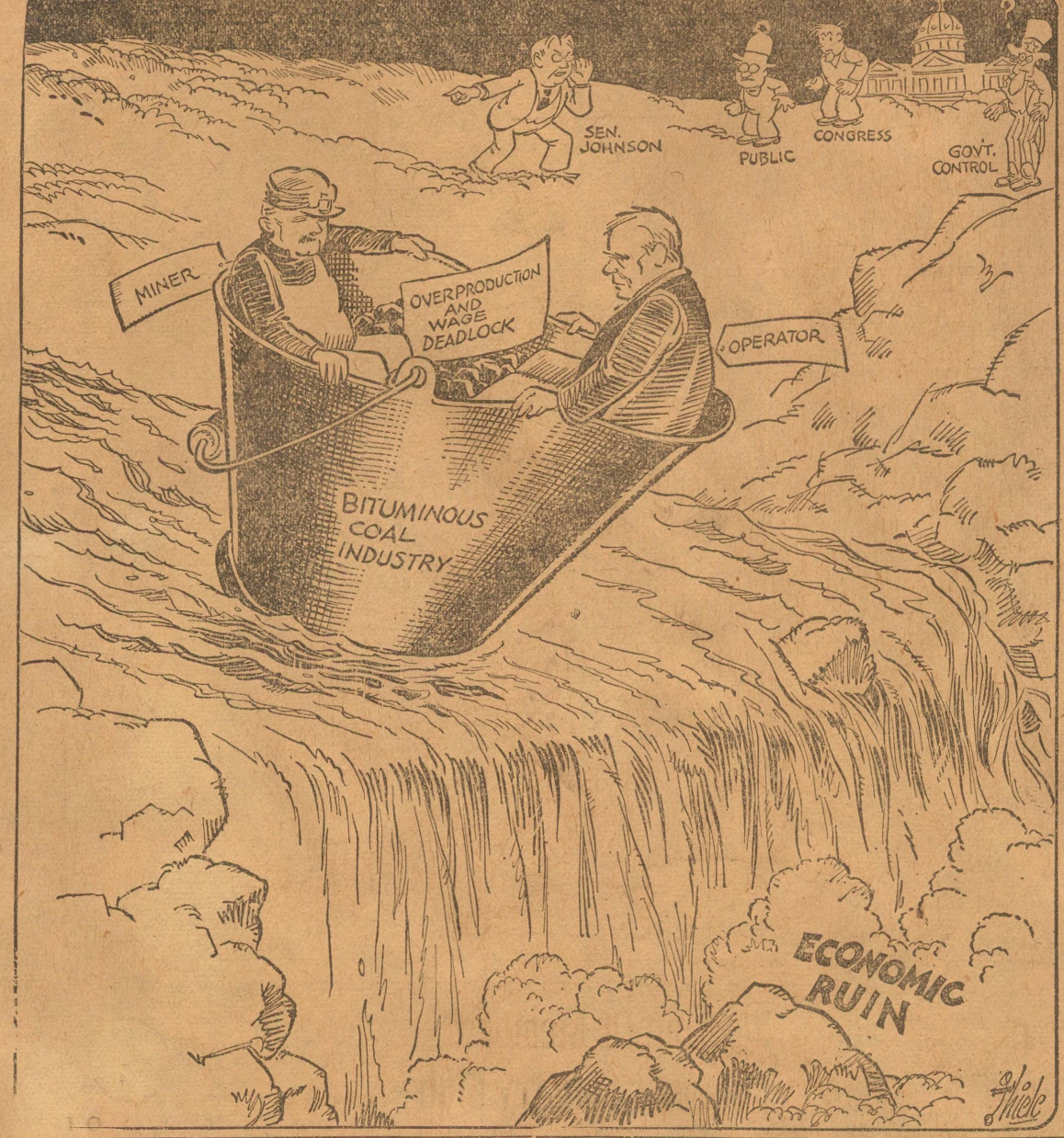

It was just half past two when Swacker announced the return of Tra-

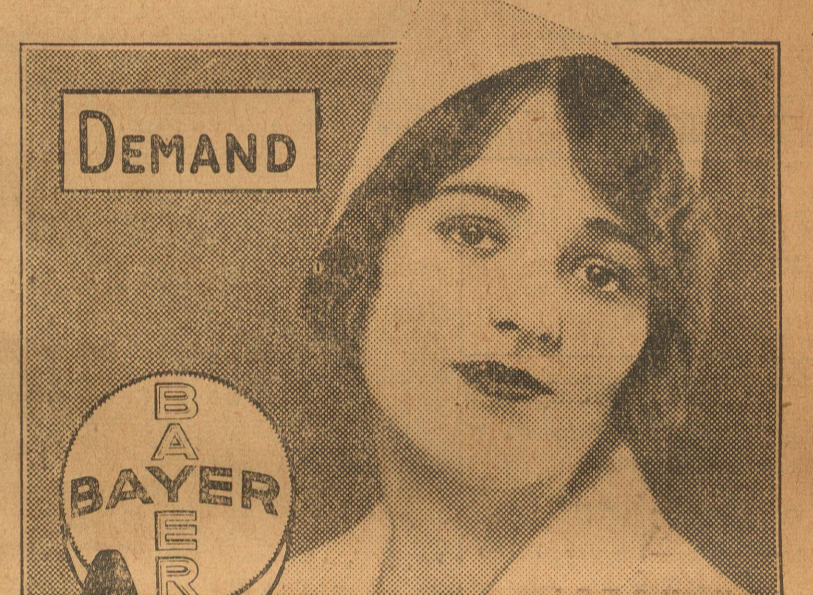
