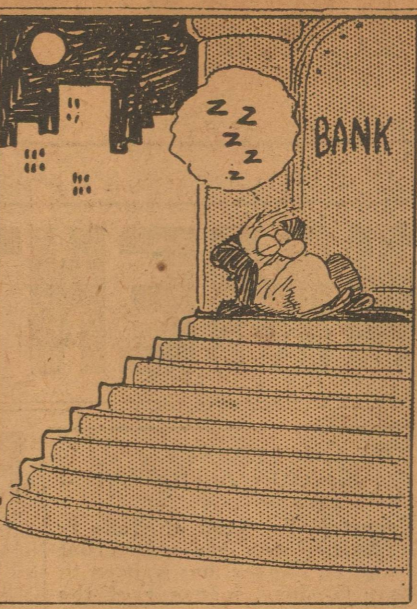
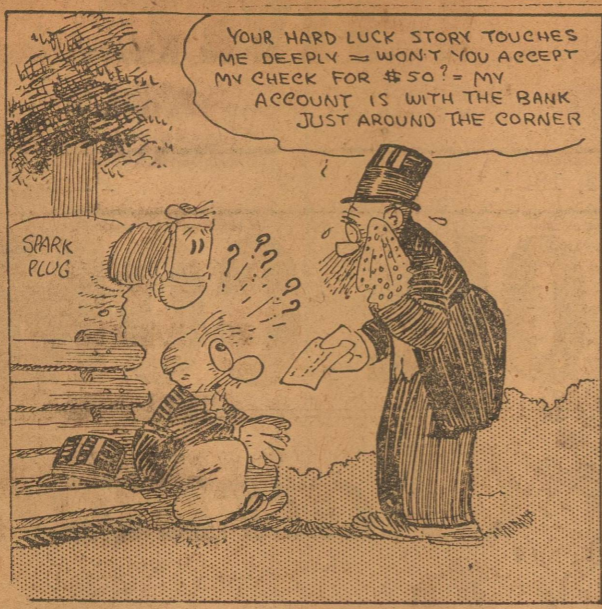

U. S. WILL WIN OLYMPIC GAMES SAYS OBSERVER

NEW YORK, June 25.—America will win the track and field championship at the Olympic games, with something to spare.

Despite the new system of scoring, devised deliberately to make more difficult the inevitable American triumph, and the fact that, with the exception of the marathon, the maximum number of entries permitted in any one event is four, the Stars and Stripes will be up the flag-pole at Colombes stadium oftener than the colors of any of the other 41 nations entered.

If this country were represented by but one team, this might be a risky prediction, even with the apparently overwhelming strength of our men. But there are three or four teams over there at Paris, enough stars to win two championships at once, if one were held in Poland and the other in Peoria, Ill.

In the sprints, for instance, we have eight men who are all so fast that if any of them are out of shape at the moment, others can fill their spiked shoes, and there will be no time lost.

Of America's short distance men, Jackson Scholz is best. The "come-back" of the former Missouri star, who was thought to have hung up his spiked shoes for good, has been one of the athletic marvels of an age which has seen many try the stunt and fail.

E. S. PRITCHARD ANNOUNCES FOR COUNTY JUDGE

E. S. Pritchard, candidate for re-election to the office of county judge of Eastland county, states his platform of principles on which he is standing in asking for the support of the voters. He says:

To the Voters of Eastland County: In as much as it will be impossible for me to meet all the voters of this county in person, I take this method of announcing my candidacy for re-

election to the office of county judge for second term.

Some voters have possibly not made up their minds as to whom they shall support in this election. For that reason I now submit several reasons why, I believe, I should be returned again to the office of county judge.

First, I have managed the financial interests of the county successfully. When I went into the county judge's office the county had less than \$16,000.00 in actual cash and owed approximately \$125,000.00, due within 30 days from that date, which situation I successfully met. The county has redeemed over one-half million dollars worth of the road bond debt, including interest, since I became county judge. The county is having to meet heavy obligations for the next two years on

account of a great many of the road bonds falling due; therefore it would be a very dangerous proposition to put in an inexperienced man in the county judge's office at this time.

Second, I have put into practice a badly needed custom in this county. This is the custom of having all county officials make monthly reports. The county has lost thousands of dollars in the past by permitting county officers to wait until they go out of office to pay the county its part of the fees, and county officials in the past have found themselves ruined for life by not making these reports, and turning over the county's part of the office fees at the close of each month. This method is a great help to the county, and is much safer for the county officials.

Third, I have safeguarded all

county funds deposited in bank depositories. I have Liberty bonds and government certificates to cover every dollar of county money in said depository. If the depository should fail, the county would not be delayed in the use of its funds, and would not even be compelled to go to the expense of a law suit to recover its funds. The Liberty bonds and government certificates could be sold and the county have its money back in 24 hours without the loss of one dime, and without delay.

Fourth, on account of my experience and knowledge of the county affairs I have been able to eliminate thousands of dollars of useless and extravagant expenditures from the county treasury.

Fifth, the present commissioners' court has a great constructive and helpful road program started at this time, which cannot possibly be completed during this term. The present court has completed about 109 miles of hard surfaced roads, 85 miles of which is being taken over by the state highway department for maintenance. The taking over of the maintenance of these roads by the state will enable the commissioners' court to use the 15-cent constitutional road tax on the lateral roads, and within the next two years, by the use of the county road machinery we can construct good lateral roads throughout all rural communities in this county.

Sixth, the county has suits pending aggregating hundreds of thousands of dollars. These are law suits resulting from mis-application of the road bond funds, and funds lost in bank depositories prior to my administration as county judge. All of these suits are based on claims which the county justly deserves. The taxpayers' money has been squandered and dissipated. Since I am familiar with the merits of these various law suits, I feel like I can serve the county more efficiently than a new man could at this time.

Seventh, I have stood for the best interests of the county and have encouraged the development of all its enterprises.

Eighth, I am only asking for a

second term. This is the time honored democratic principle. If you feel that I have made good I deserve your support.
