Mr. Seastrunk had been in ill health for the past several years, being able to be up and feet about most of the time, however. He is survived by his widow and four children: Mrs. Jettie Digsby of Bir Springs; Miss Annie Mae Seastrunk of Carbon and Sam and Lafayette Seastrunk of Carbon. Pete Seastrunk of Eastland, is a brother.

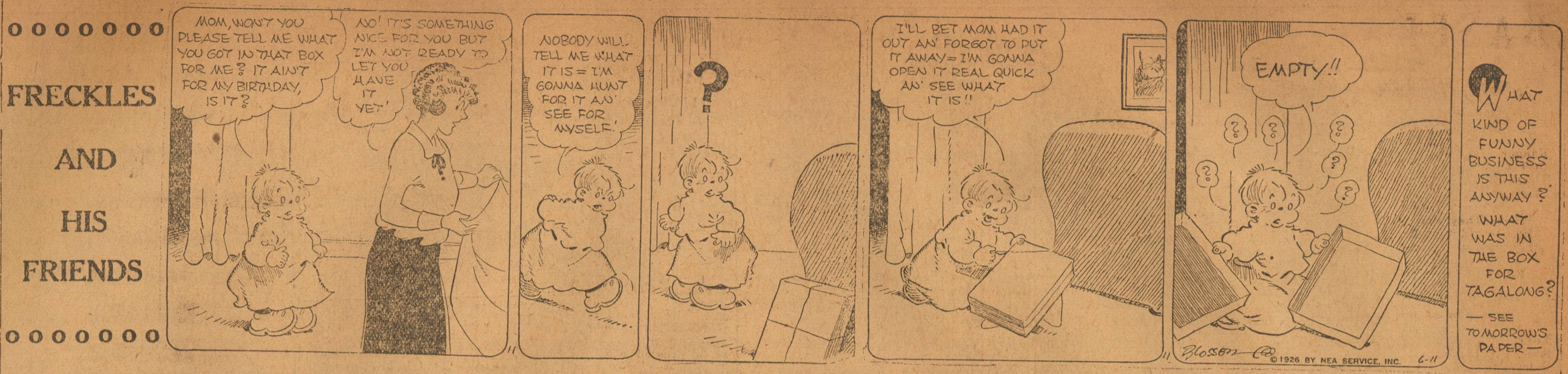

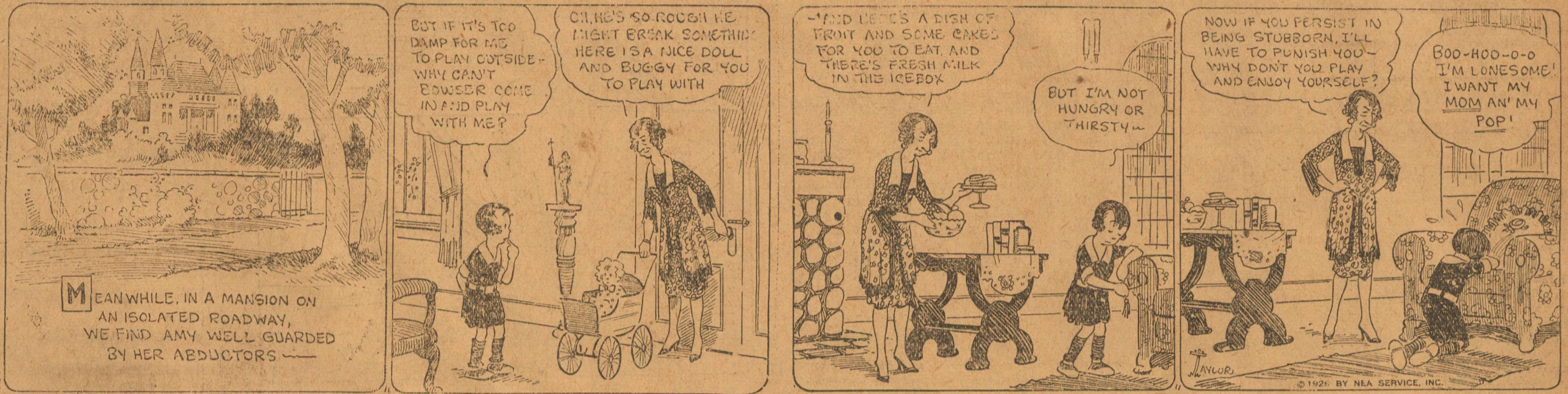

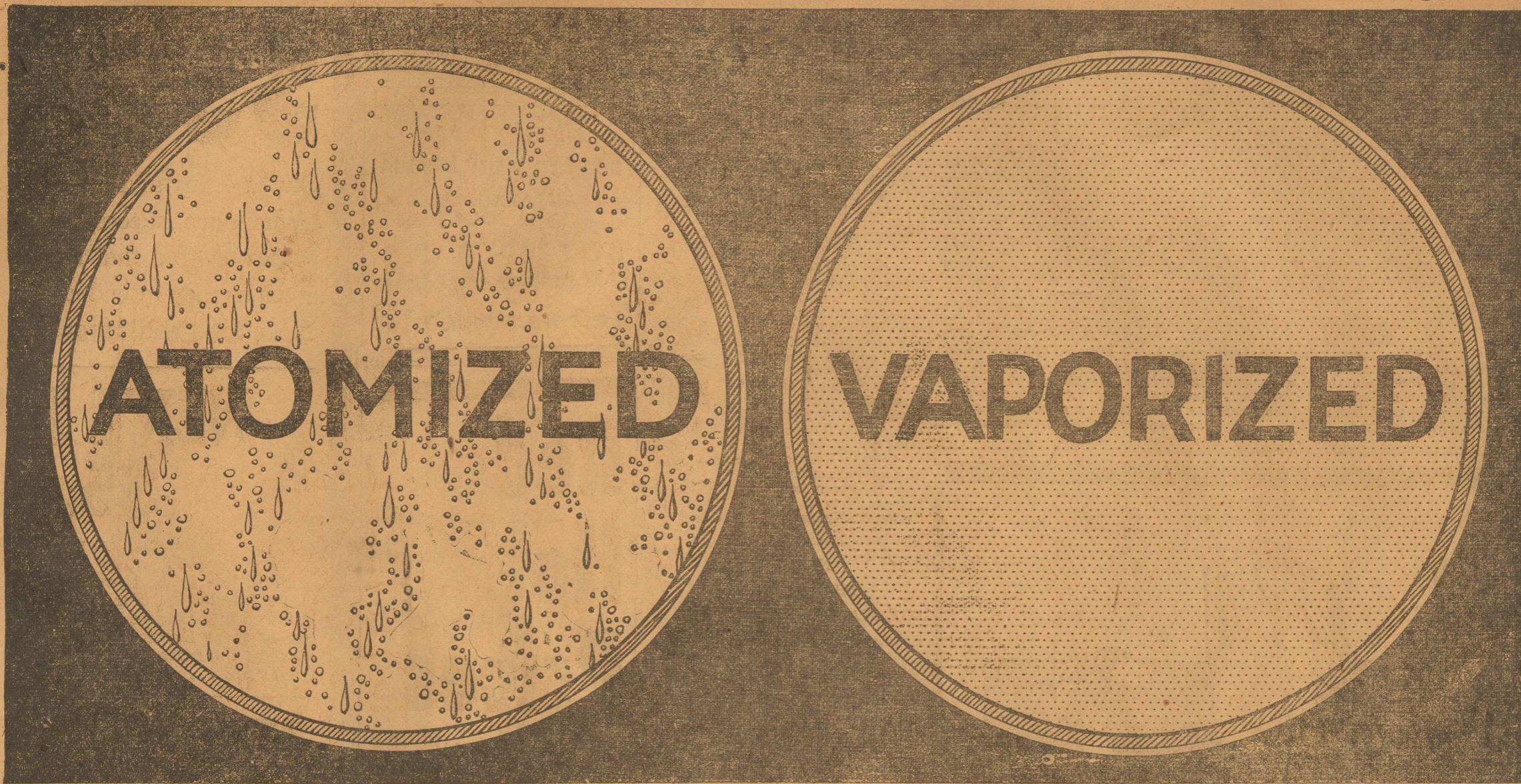
