Earthquakes jarred South Italy, and North Africa, and the Eastern Mediterranean states during the week-end.

The shock was first reported from Cairo, Malta, and Rome Saturday night. The extent of damage or possible loss of life, is not estimated, but it appears that the disturbance is unusually wide spread, although not Rome reported no damage in Italy

Rome reported no damage in Italy or Tripoli; while damage in Cairo was believed to have been slight.

According to information received from London, most of the islands in the Aegean and Mediterranean Seas seem to have suffered the greatest loss. The shock was particularly severe in Crete and Rhodes, where numerous villages are said to have collapsed.


