# IN CALUMET, ARIZ

Tells Dramatic Story Of Being Kidnaped; Is Missing Since May 18

By United Press.

DOUGHLASS, Ariz., June 23. -Missing since May 18, when she was reported to have drowned in the surf in Ocean Park, Calif., Mrs. Aimee Semple McPherson, noted Los Angeles, evangelist, was brought to Cal-umet and placed in the Arizona hospital here today, from Mexico, where, according to her own dramatic story she has been held a captive by Amerkidnappers.

Picked up exhausted by Arizona motorists, and brought from Triets, Mexico,. Mrs. McPherson arrived here today in custody of Mexica police and was placed under care of the hospital authorities.

This ends a most sensational case. Mrs. McPherson's followers kept a watch for several days on the seashere expecting to see her rise again. At one time it was thought that she was in the Northwest. A detective wired back to Los Angeles from whence she disappeared that she was nad begun and has carried it on.

PARIS, June 23. - Joseph Caillaux, convicted of trafficing with the enemy during the war, and the man who last year failed in Lis efforts to fund the \$4,002,000,000 French war debt to the United States, today accepted the job of preventing nation-

al bankruptcy.
Caillaux accepted the ministry of finance in Aristide Briand's proposed cabinet, after twice refusing participate in the cabinet.

It is understood that Briand was prepared to admit defeat in his efforts to form a tenth cabinet, when Caillaux arrived at the foreign office for one more conference which the

premier designated.

"I want all of the power," Caillaux said, after accepting the premiership, "but I see no difficulty in sharing the power with Briand."


