

Big Damage Suits Brought Against 2 Thrill Killers

ATLANTA, Ga., Oct. 30.—Two wealthy Oglgethorpe university students, George Harsh and Richard Gallogly, faced first degree murder indictments here today and damage suits totaling \$150, 000growing out of the "thrill holdups" that ended in tragedy.

A Fulton county grand jury re-turned formal charges against them 48 hours after their arrest for the holdup-slaying of E. R. Meeks, grocery store clerk, and Willard Smith, drug store clerk. Police said they took the indict-

ments calmly.

Meanwhile Mrs. Mary Belle Smith, widowed at 19 by one of the slayings, has filed suit for \$100,000 against the two youthful defendants while I. V. Ellis, where Market manager of the store where Meek was slain, has sued for \$50,000. Ellis was wounded in the holdups
