PANAMA CANAL TRAFFIC FLOW BREAKS RECORD

Governor Walker In His Report Forecasts Eventual Enment

WASHINGTON .- Eventual enlargement of the Panama canal to care for rapidly increasing traffic port made public today of Gover-nor M. L.
