## OF THE CISCO BANK HOLDUP

Spectacular Santa Claus Robbery Occurred Just One Year Ago.

One year ago today, guns blazed forth and men toppled over in the alley beside the Cisco bank in

holdup.

A police dragnet has been thrown about Shreveport for the bandits who were seen loitering near the bank just before the shooting. Two of the bandits were well dressed. The other had only one arm.

The money in Purnell's cage amounting to about \$12,000, was untouched by the bandits. Purnell was shot in the mouth and his jawbone was broken. He is not expected to live. Other employes of the bank did not know of the holdup until Purnell had been shot.
