# TELEPHONE EXCHANGE UP TO PRESENT TENANTS, SAYS POE

Wichita Falls Aroused When President Will Make Decision Owner of Building Says Company's Plans Indicate Belief That Ranger Will Be a City of Magnitude.

> The local telephone company will begin the work of attering the upper story of the Poe building on Marston street for the use of their offices and exchange by Jan. 1. This information was given out by A. B. Poe, owner of the building, this morning. Work would begin by Dec. 1, Mr. Poe stated if the tenants now in the upper story of the milding found new quarters by that date. The telephone company have a space seventy-five feet square, and at a cost of several thousand dollars it will remodel the space to lit its needs. The partitions will be reset, lighting and plumbing rearranged.

oom for the women workers. "We are planning an exchange that vill care for the needs of a city of 40, 000 population. Our equipment will be of the latest design with preparations made for 2,500 telephones," General Manager Carter, of the telephone company told Mr. Poe at the time of signing the lease, which is for a long term of years. The company is planning to start the exchange with 1,000 telephones, then additional ones as fast as needed.



"The manufacturer has turned his ingenuity toward the invention of new types of toys; toys that are miniature replicas in many instances of the scientific and mechanical triumphs of the day No other country has ever developed so many entertaining, instructive and edu cation toys as have been placed on the market in this country during the past

This is particularly true of mechani cal toys. New types of motors have been invented for the miniature automobiles, airplanes, submarines and trains that are being manufactured by the millions this year. And American toy man-ufacturing is still in its infancy.

"The toy industry abroad, particularly in Germany, the greatest toy country, and in Japan, is essentially a home industry, with the imperfection and lack of standardization which this implies. Ahe American industry is a machine instandardized and manufactured at a cost which, under present conditions, cannot be duplicated abroad.

For example, the concern of which I am president produces 6,000 comple mechanical trains daily, which ar stamped out on ninety punch presses There are approximately 300,000,000 to balloons produced in this country annually, and a factory is now in course 1,000,000 balloons a week.


