| By Associafed Press. <br> WASHINGTON, Aug. 21.-A bill to carry into effect President Harding's recommendation for a govern- ment investigation of, the coal indusment investigation of, the coal indus- try was introduced today by Chairman Winslow of the house commerce committe, after a visit to the White House. <br> The measure would create a commission of nine members, to be known as the United States coal coming information regarding all questions and problems arising from and in connection with the coal industry. No members of congress or any nected with the industry would be eligible to serve on the commission. The salary of commissioners would be at the rate of $\$ 10,000$ a year, and be at the rate of $\$ 10,000$ a year, and ist one year after the act took effect. <br> Chairman Borah of the senate labor committee issued a call for a reeting of his committee tomorrow to take up the President's recommenda- tion for a coal fact-firding committee.
