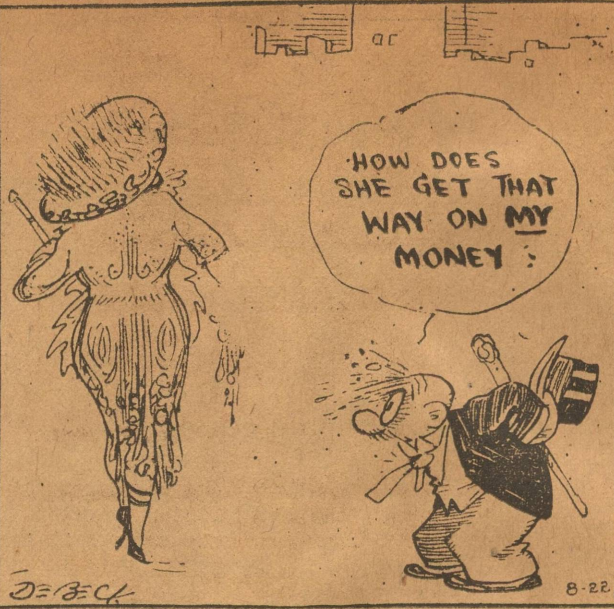
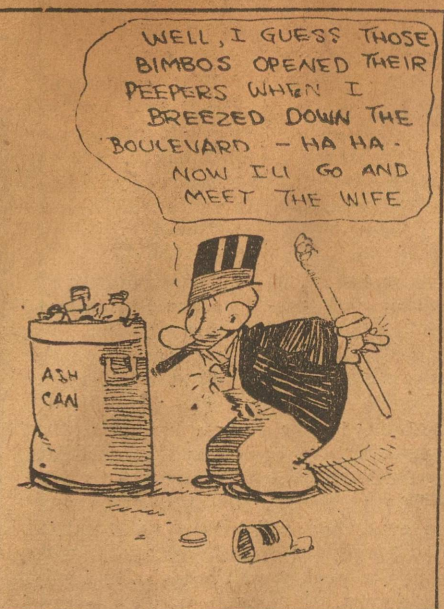

'IRON MAN' M'GINNITY AT 51, STILL EFFECTIVE PERFORMER ON DIAMOND

DUBUQUE, Iowa, Aug. 22.—When "Iron Man" Joe McGinnity flicker out of the picture? Not for another decade is the guess of most Dubuque fans who have seen McGinnity lead their Mississippi Valley league club through many hard-fought battles.

Wet Ball Genius. McGinnity's famed mastery of the wet ball has not left him. He demonstrated this recently by pitching a game on a rain-soaked field after he had vigorously opposed postponement of the contest.

For the "Iron Man," though 51 years old, retains all the fire, and his right arm much of the speed and control that made him the idol of New York fandom 20 years ago.

Once or twice a week old-timers are thrilled by the spectacle of Joe mounting the slab and turning in a neat pitching performance. Thirty years of continuous service have failed materially to sap his strength, while age has merely added to his fund of baseball cunning.

McGinnity admits that he finds nearly as much satisfaction in letting minor clubs down with six or seven hits in his fifty-first year as he did in outpitching "Rube" Waddell in the great Pittsburgh-Brooklyn series in 1900, for some of the Class D batters while lacking "polish" brandish mighty menacing bludgeons.
