HUNTSVILLE, Texas, Sept. 1.—Two prisoners of the state penitentiary today made a daring escape after seriously injuring B. F. Oliver, assistant warden.

Oliver was walking through the prison yard shortly before noon when he was set upon by Maximino Vega, Mexican, and Ernest Connor, of Fort Worth, armed with knives. They forced the assistant warden to walk ahead of them to the forty-foot wall of the yard and to a guardhouse on top. The guards could not shoot at the convicts without hitting Oliver. Reaching the top, the men disarmed the guard and pushed him and Oliver back into the yard, and escaped before an alarm could be given. Posses of county officers are hunting for the men.

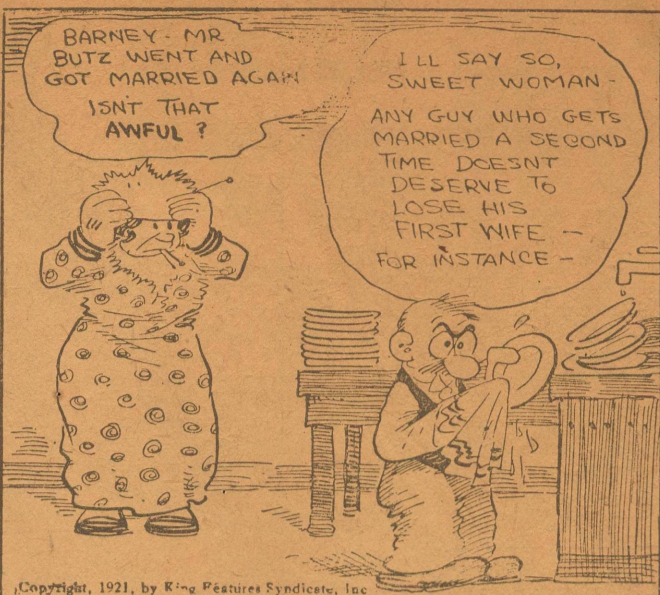
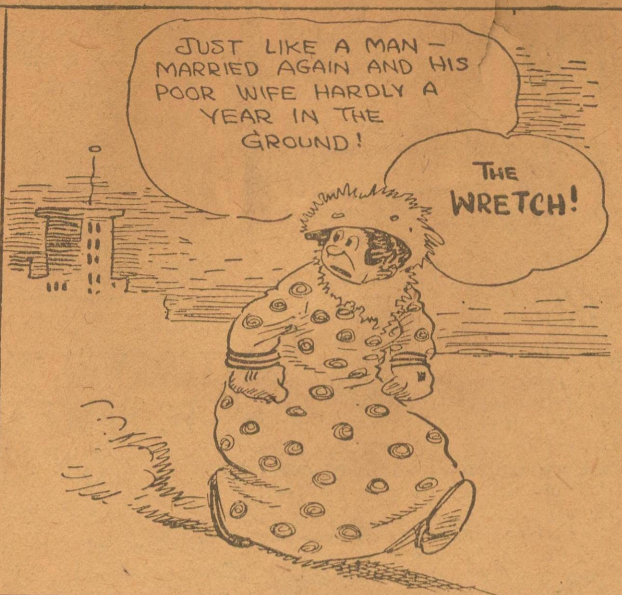

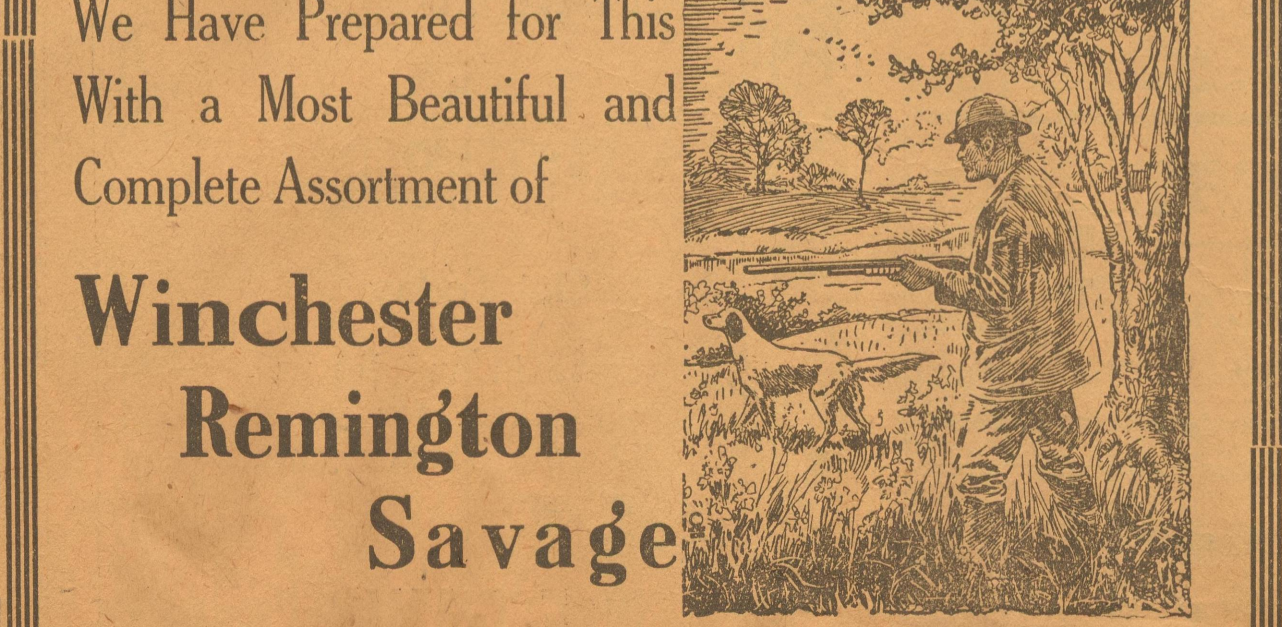
