ARDMORE, Okla., Dec. 17 .- Authorities today were endeavoring to link the activities of a prominent secret organization with the death of Joe Carroll and John Smith of Wilson, and C. G. Sims, Ardmore policeman, who were shot to death near Wilson, Thursday night.

In a statement issued today, county Attorney Hodges asserted that Sims was wearing what is purported to be a Ku Klux Klan regalia at the time his body was found.



SOUTH'S BLACKS **MOVE TO NORTH**

WASHINGTON, Dec. 17 .- Southern-born negro population which has migrated to the North and West has increased from 440,534 in 1910 to 780,794 in 1920, the census bureau announced today in a report on the negro population. The southern boundaries of Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Ohio, Illinois, Indiana, Missouri and Kansas were taken as the dividing line between the North and South for the purposes of the report. Of the 10,381,309 negroes enumerated in the last census, there were 38,575 for whom no state of birth was reported. The 780,794 southern-born negroes showed to have migrated comprised 8.1 per cent of the total number of negroes born in southern sections.




