COAL BAN TO CONTINUE
WASHINGTON, Dec. 9.-In the face of the expect ed settlement of the coal strike at Indianapolis, Fuel Ad ministrator Garfield put into effect today the most dra
tic regulations for fucl economy since 1918. Even if th strike is settled, he declared that fuel saving nieasures may be necessary for several weeks. Plants using bituminous coal or coke will be restricted to operation thres days of work on the basis of the present workino hours

An excention is made to plants manufacturiros what are considered necessary products and thase consuming anthracite coal, gas and other fuels.

The order includes the curtailment of street lis ing and heat for office buildings and industrial plants current for street railways.
