Washington, Dec. 9--- The White House announced this afternoon that the miners have accepted President Wilson's proposal for settlement of the coal strike.

The plan provides for the immediate resumption of work; a 14 per cent increase, and the appointment of a commission to investigate and readjust wages to conform with the cost of living.

INDIANAPOLIS, Dec. 9.—Settlement of the coal strike within twenty-four hours was confidently predicted today. The executive board and scale committee of the United Mine Workers were to meet at 2 o'clock this afternoon to consider President Wilson's proposal for settling the strike.

COLD ADDS TO SUFFERING.

CHICAGO, Dec. 9.—Hope of paving the way for a final settlement of the coal strike turned to Indianapolis today as an extension of the stringent fuel administration rationing orders reduced the nation's industries virtually to half time basis.

The most severe weather of the winter with zero temperatures and further depletion of the diminished coal reserve gripped the western part of the country with its spread southward and eastward for tomorrow and Thursday.

At Butte, Mont., the temperature was 30 degrees below zero. Hundreds are reported in distress from hunger and cold. At Lander, Wyo., it was 31 degrees below zero and the temperature at various other places in Oregon was 25 below. Great Falls, Mont., was the coldesti place with 32 below.

NORTHWEST SUFFERS.

SPOKANE, Dec. 9.—Biting cold and no fuel was the situation reported in dozens of northwestern communities today while many others reported wood was the only available fuel.

The most suffering was reported from Butte, where that city authorized the mayor to spend \$5,000 for relief and the county increased its relief funds by \$25,000 per

COAL BAN TO CONTINUE.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 9.—In the face of the expected settlement of the coal strike at Indianapolis, Fuel Administrator Garfield put into effect today the most dra tic regulations for fuel economy since 1918. Even if th strike is settled, he declared that fuel saving measures may be necessary for several weeks. Plants using bituminous coal or coke will be restricted to operation three days of work on the basis of the present working hours.

An exception is made to plants manufacturing what are considered necessary products and those consuming

anthracite coal, gas and other fuels. The order includes the curtailment of street light ing and heat for office buildings and industrial plants a current for street railways.



THE WEST'S PROBLEM.

The influx of new people to Western Texas—the greatest in the history of the section-should cause many towns which expect to profit permanently to prepare to keep them. One of the most forbidding things in a city is the lack of houses. No matter how well pleased newcomers are with the beauties of a city and its advantages, they will not be drawn unless some sort of accomodation is made for them to become citizens.

The ingress of people has been greater than the supply of houses available. A little more than a year ago houses were very numerous in the west. In some of the larger communities persons could find them in almost any portion of these cities, and at his own price. But the oil fields and the fine crops have brought such a burden of people that the house surhas been exhausted. And it i a travesty on a number of these towns that they are not now preparing to take care of the flood of new people coming to "look them over."

After all, it is the people a town gets that makes it. A town with superior advantages in the way of which does not provide the means for other people to come to it, is exclusive. It shows no concern for its futuie. It takes for granted that if people want to live there they will build. But they do not take into consideration that there are hundreds and hundreds of people who would become citizens of such cities if they were provided houses. They might in time amass enough money in these strenuous days of the high cost of living to buy on the installment plan. Housing organizations should be organized at once and aid should be extended

the new citizens until he can pay out. The West's most vexing problem at the present time is housing and the smiting and discountenancing of the rent profiteer, who seems to have become a fixture in almost all west Texas towns, doing not only the towns and cities, but themselves irreparable






