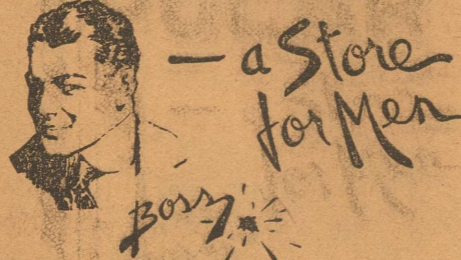

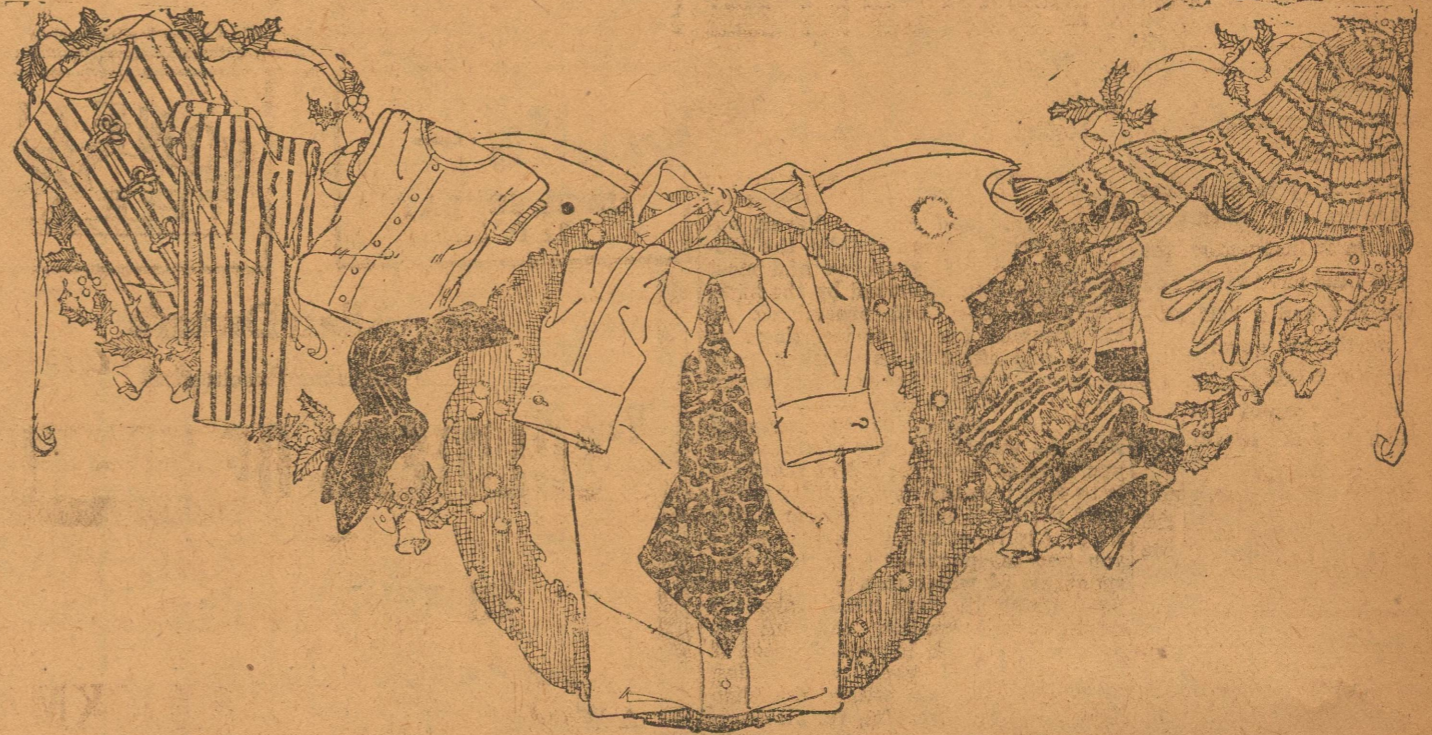

News Solos of World Sung by the Wires

AUSTIN.—Preparations are being made by the attorney general's department to institute mandamus proceedings against every county judge of every county in the state who has not sent in returns of the vote cast in the election on the proposed constitutional amendments.

FORT WORTH.—A permanent injunction restraining Hugh H. Lewis, Jr., from building a garage, repair shop and filling station at Fruit street and Sixth avenue, has been granted by Judge Bruce Young, of the Forty-eighth district court.

BOSTON.—An aged woman and two children are suffering serious burns as a result of two sensational fires, one in a Back Bay apartment house and the other in a South Boston tenement. About 150 residents of the apartment were forced to flee, thinly clad.

McALESTER.—R. H. Davis, who was found with his throat cut and a razor nearby, was buried here in the lot where lie his four children, whom he had lost during the past two years by a cyclone and influenza.

WASHINGTON.—President Wilson has asked congress for \$25,000 to defray the expenses of the second industrial conference, now in session.

WASHINGTON.—President and Mrs. Wilson quietly celebrated their fourth wedding anniversary. As on previous occasions, the president gave Mrs. Wilson a handsome present selected by him, but purchased by a member of the president's household staff.

LONDON.—The note which the allies are drafting demanding the extradition of the ex-kaiser from Holland, is not to be presented until after final ratification of the peace treaty.

WACO.—Sam Sanger, 76, first vice president of the Sanger houses of Texas, died suddenly at his home here Wednesday, December 18.

McALESTER.—Oklahoma's coal production was reduced to 50 per cent of capacity when the miners refused to work in four of the principal shafts.

FORT WORTH.—To relieve holiday congestion, the T. & P. night baggage, mail and express train from Fort Worth to Baird has been temporarily extended to Sweetwater. This train leaves Fort Worth at 11 p. m. No passengers are carried.

Says North La. Field Overrated

FORT WORTH, Dec. 19.—Paul Konz, who has just returned from a tour of the North Louisiana oil fields, believes that the enthusiasm there is not justified by the development. He said North Louisiana is getting a big play, from Shreveport to Monroe. He said Louisiana is getting some real oil, but that pipe lines are inadequate and practically all the wells are shut in.

Konz said that there are 240 wild-cat wells drilling in the northern part of the state, and that future developments of the field depend almost entirely on the success of these wells.

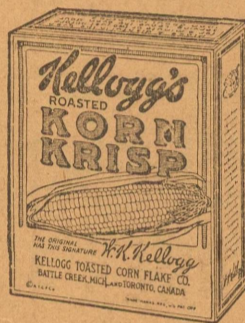

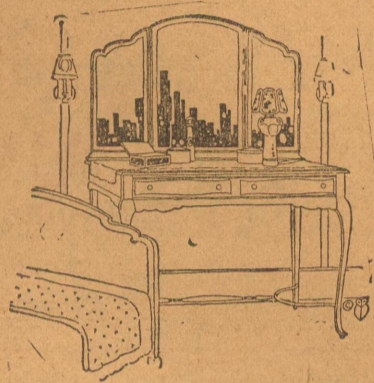

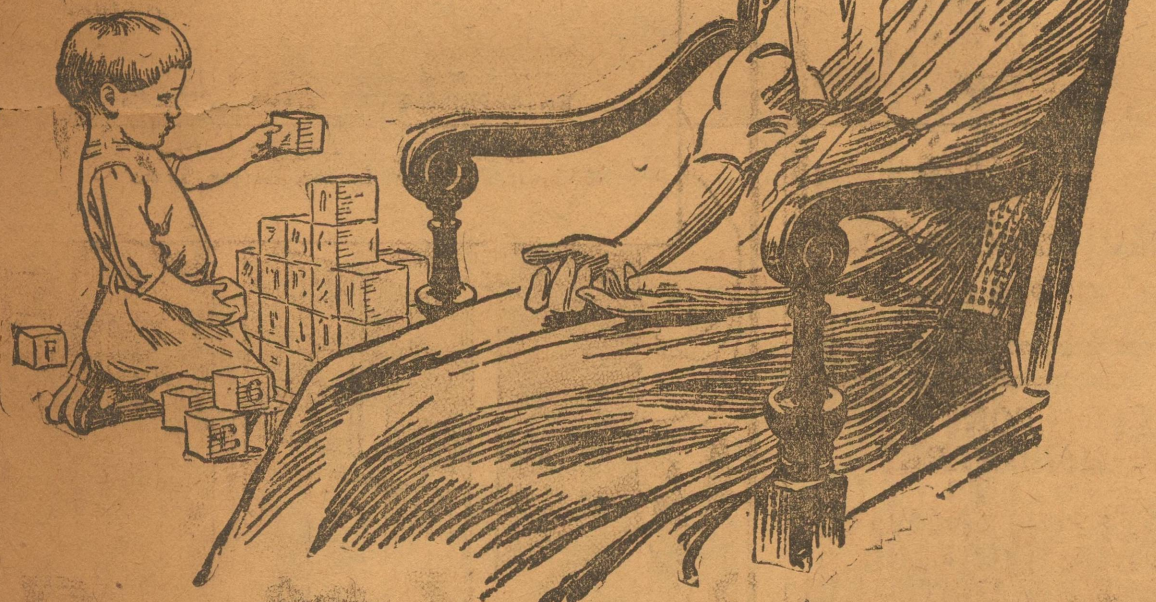
