Chief of Police Byron B. Parrish has been offered the columns of the Times ell the people of Ranger what he has done and is doing to stop open gambling Ranger, but has declined to avail himself of the privilege, and the questions asked
by the Times Thursday remain unanswered

It is to be assumed, however, that he has acted as directed by the city commis sion since its Tuesday meeting, for search of the city in every quarter Thursday night failed to reveal any game in progress. Furthermore, the chief is reported to even though he had to use the most stringent measures to prevent it.

The chief of police has done some effective work in preventing crime in Ranger and in arresting law breakers and at times has kept open gambling down in this city He has shown that open gambling can be stopped, at least temporarily. If there is any the people of Ranger to know it-possibly they can help to find the cure.

Mayor Hagaman and the city commissioners and City Manager Turner are earnst advocates of strict enforcement of the law against gambling. "We realize that i
Is a difficult task, but it can be done," said the mayor.

The open gambling element in Ranger is small but persistent. The law provides ways and means to discourage this persistence and it has been suggested that the
police make use of them. Continued raids of open games with arrests and subse quent fining of the gamblers would exercise a deterrent influence and add something e city's exchequer. The discouragement might be pushed further.
