

DUMAS, Ark., Jan. 22.—Led by Governor Brough, 125 regular army soldiers from Camp Pike arrived here carly today on a special train and will start an immediate search for the negroes who yesterday attacked local officers and took from them Doc Hays, a negro arrested for stealing hogs.

The negroes are at a settlement twelve miles east of here. The troops will march to the place because of the

fact that the roads are impassable. The negroes in that section are said to outnumber the whites thirty to one.

A renewal of the race rioting in Arkansas appears likely. A large posse of citizens set out from here yeslerday to capture fifteen or more negroes who fired on three deputy sheriffs and forced them to surrender the negro prisoner who was being conducted to jail.

Dumas is about sixty miles southwest of Elaine, Ark., the scene of the negro uprising of last_October, when a number of persons were killed before the outbreak was checked. Dumas is also ten miles north of Winchester, headquarters of Robert Hill, alleged leader of the Elaine insurrectionists.
