Nannie Walker No. 1 is located on the joint holding of the Vulcan with Texas Pacific Coal and Oil company, in block 6, section 44, twelve miles north of Ranger, near the new town of Frankell.

The well struck the top of the black lime at 3,212 feet and went through it without a shot. It started flowing at midnight, when it struck a second pay at 3,574 feet.

Natural production without the use of nitro hypos is unusual in Stephens county wells.


