If "money talks," the argument has force; still, there is more than the one-time pedagogue's present opinion of the matter to be considered.

Recently a St. Louis man walked off with his firm's payroll, amounting to many thousands of dollars. It was more money than any one of a majority of people in this city who work for wages can earn in a year. Yet a robber is not in better effort than any of these less richly compensated workers follows. Considered merely from the matter of its financial "rewards," dishonesty might be held to be a profitable business. 




