Preparedness for war on the part of a peace-loving people is insurance against war. This great truth no Anierican can afford to overlook.

So far as it is not based upon lack of understanding, opposition to universal training is mainly the product of undemocratic sentiments such as those in the south, where there is an element that does not wish young negroes to learn the lessons of American manhood and self-respect that are a part of the training for military service. 
