EVANGELIST AT CHURCH OF CHRIST REPLIES TO MOOTED QUESTION

SUNDAY AT CENTRAL BAPTIST CHURCH

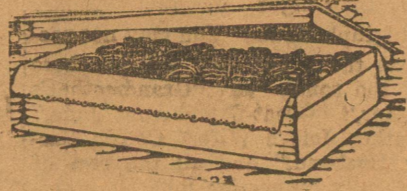
