POLICE RECORD SHOWS SEVEN "VAGS" ARRESTED

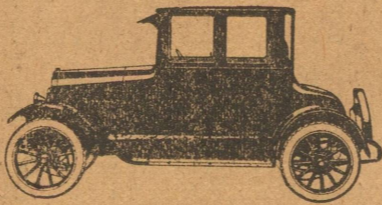

RANGER PULLMAN IS WANTED FOR NIGHT TRAINS

A Pullman car for Ranger on the eastbound and westbound Texas & Pacific railroad night trains is needed. Chamber of Commerce directors appointed a committee of three men last night to confer with Ranger hotel proprietors and managers before pushing the demand for this service.

After a suggestion had been made to the board that it would be desirable to attach a Ranger Pullman car on trains Nos. 11 and 12, it was agreed that before formally taking the matter up with the T. & P. passenger officials, a consultation with hotel men would be held.

M. R. Newnam said there were many business men of Ranger who liked to ride a sleeper into Fort Worth and on the return trip as well, but the train hours were very inconvenient. "I like to take a sleeper when I go down and back from Fort Worth," he said. "I think there's a number of business men who would like to use a Ranger Pullman when going to Fort Worth."

The lack of a Ranger Pullman causes men out of Fort Worth who have business here and in Breckenridge and Ranger to go on through to Breckenridge, it was said. There is a through Breckenridge Pullman.

O. D. Dillingham said he had talked to railroad officials in Fort Worth relative to resuming the service and that he believed the railroad would restore the service on a 30-day trial basis. "We can ask Eastland to cooperate with us in using the service," he said. "Let's push it among the business men and make it a paying proposition for the railroad." He said there has been some complaint among traveling men at the lack of such service.

If the plan is carried through, the Pullman would be set in the railroad yards and the berths open at a certain hour for occupancy. The westbound train would leave the Ranger Pullman on a siding and the berths could be occupied until about 7 o'clock.

Heavy Tax on Oil Production Would Discourage Boring

Business men throughout the oil fields will feel the effects of the Coffee bill which would increase the tax on crude oil production, O. D. Dillingham, president of the Ranger Chamber of Commerce, said last night in explaining the proposed visit to the oil fields of Eastland county next week by a delegation of legislators.

"The tour will show them why they shouldn't tax the producers," he said. "When they have seen the abandoned fields, the plugged wells and the great amount of money invested in the abandoned property it may cause them to feel different."

Fear was expressed generally by the directors that if the tax is levied on the producers, wildcat drilling will be discouraged in the oil belt. The view was commonly expressed that the tax, if it must be placed, should be put on the users of oil and gasoline and not on the producers.

REPUBLICANS OPPOSE HARDING'S PLAN TO ENTER WORLD COURT

WASHINGTON, April 20.—Expressing the belief that Republican opposition to the United States participation in the world court of international justice was even stronger than that against entrance to the League of Nations, Representative W. R. Wood of Indiana, Republican congressional campaign committee chairman, today told President Harding that he believed it a mistake for the party to champion the court.

This is the first opposition to the President's plan of court participation outside of the group of "irreconcilables" in the senate.

The 1924 Olympic games, to be held in Paris, are scheduled to open Jan. 20 and end July 27. The big feature from the point of view of the United States will come in July, when the track and field athletic games will run for nine days, from July 5 to July 13. The 1928 games will be held in Amsterdam, Holland, and the 1932 games in Los Angeles, Calif.

AREONAUTICAL GUIDE BOOK WITH CAMP SITES AND MAPS PUBLISHED

The initial compilation for popular circulation of a guide to airplane landing fields throughout the United States is just off the press. The book, which also includes a most complete directory of camp sites for automobilists, was especially published for the National Aeronautic association for distribution from Washington headquarters to its members, and the United States army air service lent its co-operation in making the list of landing fields as complete as possible. In cloth cover and of convenient pocket size, the new guide contains beside the informative text a large map of the United States showing the location of landing fields in all states, and on the reverse side all the established auto camp sites. The guide is issued by the United States Touring Information bureau of Waterloo, Iowa, whose general manager, L. B. Strothman, is a pioneer in development of camp site information and automobile itineraries.

In securing the compilation of official and correct information relative to conveniences for aircraft throughout the country, the National Aeronautic association sought to perform a public service while at the same time aiding its membership, which through an intensive campaign in May is expected to show an enrollment of 100,000 for this year. The association is appealing to forward-looking men and women to join this patriotic peace-time movement whose goal is "America first in the air."

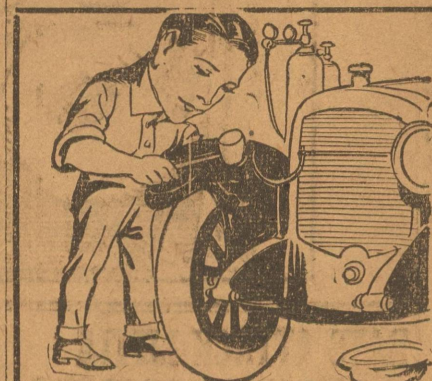
