# In the Community, in the Home, Forbid Every Day in the Week All Pleasure Wrong on Sunday

County Attorney Barnes has explained that he is seeking to close the moving picture houses in Ranger at the request of the

If the majority of the people of Cisco do not want Sunday movies, or the sale of cigars, soft drinks, gasoline and the like in Cisco on Sunday it is their privilege to bar them and the people of Ranger have no objection. Therefore if a majority of the people of Ranger wish it otherwise in Ranger the people of Cisco should have no objec-

Ranger agreed to support Cisco as the location for the Texas Technological college, but was asked to do so. When Ranger wishes to have Cisco's help in bettering her morals Ranger will not hesitate to ask. When Ranger, some time ago, thought to send a delegation to Cisco to aid in forming a good government club. Cisco wired asking Ranger not to do so, insisting she was capable of looking after her own affairs, and the delegation did

If Cisco wants moving picture shows closed there on Sunday it is her privilege to have them closed, but let Cisco look after her own morals. Other commnuities in the county are fully able to look after their conduct without the aid or advice of Cisco. If Cisco does not need or wish Ranger's help to get the Texas Technological college located there, Ranger has no intention

of forcing her aid on Cisco.

The Sunday closing law in Texas was enacted at a period when saloons were kept open, and in many places vaudeville theaters were conducted as a business aid for the saloons. These were vicious shows, lured young people from the path of virtue and were not justified on Sunday or any other day in the week. The Sunday law was intended to close them and also to close the saloons. The law finally closed the saloons every day in the week and even before that had frowned so heavily on the low class of vaudeville adjuncts of the saloons that most

of them suspended operations. When the Sunday closing law was amended to stop the sale of gasoline on Sundays, efforts were made in many places to enforce it, but a ruling that gasoline, being necessary to the transportation of many public necessities, comes under the head of a transportation facility, has made that portion of the law inoperative as contrary to public

Sunday blue laws were enacted when it was the accepted custom of the people to devote the sabbath entirely to religious devotion. It was the belief of a majority then that any pleasure on the Sabbath was wrong and so they prohibited everything that seemed likely to give peasure. The Sunday closing laws are a modification of the old blue laws, and in enforcing them the wishes of a majority of the people should prevail.

The people do not now, as formerly, believe it wrong to enjoy the Sabbath day, but they do not all agree on the latitude that may be permitted for such enjoyment. It is right that vicious amusements should be barred, but there is no justification in a few persons insisting the majority shall abide by the wishes of a very small minority in putting up bars against innocent and proper amusements. And many, perhaps a majority of the people, believe today that what is right for a weekday pleasure is proper for Sunday and what is improper for Sunday should be barred also every other day in

Moving pictures, baseball and other innocent amusements oc-

cupy the people at times when they have an interval between work and sleep for recreation, change of thought and action and pursuit of pleasure. They have more leisure on Sunday than any other day; with many it is the only day for rest and amusement, for their work endures during the week from walking to sleeping. This is especially true of people living in the country; Sunday is the only day when

amusements to keep them out of mischief. A little more than a year ago the people of Ranger voted through the Ranger Daily Times on the question of closing the moving picture shows on Sunday and a little more than five to one voted in favor of the Sunday movies. They are open on Sunday in every large city in Texas and in every large city in the nation. Yet, because Cisco wants to be the Poo Bah of Eastland county, the people of Ranger and other communities in the county

they may enjoy a moving picture

show. And young people, hav-

ing more leisure, need proper

must bow to the wishes of Cisco. God asks the people to worship Him every day in the week. The Sabbath was made for man and it is man's privilege to determine how it may best be used for man. Man is told not to work on the sabbath day, but is not forbidden to get recreation both for body and mind. God should be worshipped on the Sabbath, as on other days and even more, for worship of God is recreation, but the enforcement of blue laws is not synonymous with worship. The moving picture shows have agreed to close their doors on Sunday during the prescribed hours of worship, but Cisco is insisting her standard shall prevail rather than the wishes of a majority. Shall Ranger be ruled by Cisco?




