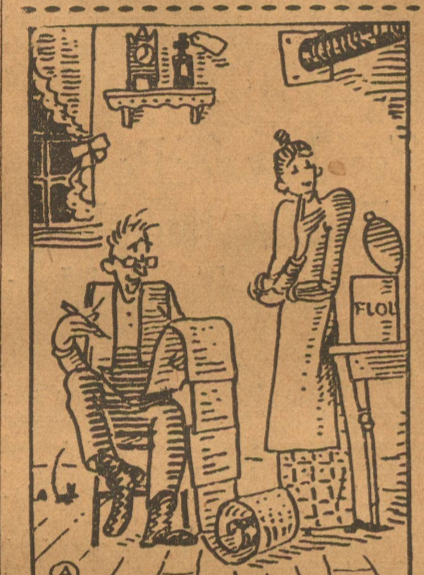

### CAVALRYMEN CALLED OUT IN SMITH COUNTY TO PREVENT TROUBLE

**NOONDAY**, Smith County, Texas, April 23.—No trouble was feared here today in connection with reports concerning the wife of a white tenant farmer here, which resulted in the arrest of three negroes the latter part of last week.

Members of Company F, of the Texas National Guard, who were rushed here Saturday to prevent possible trouble, have returned to their homes in Tyler, about 10 miles distant, and local authorities anticipate no further occasion to call them out.

Reports from Austin that a company of state troops would be sent to this section arose from a report made by the sheriff at Tyler to the adjutant general that members of Company F had been used during the week-end.




