YOUNG SCHOOL IS THREATENED

NEW YORK STATE WITH GOVERNOR

By Action on Pending Bill He May Make or Mar His Political Fortunes.

By United Press.

ALBANY, N. Y., June 1.—Governor Smith, in the role of judge and jury, has taken the case of prohibition enforcement in New York state under advisement. Before Sunday midnight he must either sign or veto the measure repealing the state enforcement act that recently was passed by the legislature.

Governor Smith, by his action on this measure, wil either make himself the leader of the "wet" forces in the United States, if he approves the bill, cr abandon the cause of Tammany Hail if he vetoes it.

The evidence is all in, having been presented in final arguments by wet and dry leaders at a five-hour hearing Thursday. The time in which the governor must act expires Sunday, midnight, but because of a doubt of the legality of signing a law on Sunday the governor is expected to act by Saturday midnight.



RANGER SNAPPERS TO

TO MEET CRIQUE FOR THE TITLE

By Associated Press

NEW YORK, June 1 .- John Pat rick Kilbane, featherweight boxing champion of the world, who is to de fend his title against Criqui, of France, in a 15-round decision contest at the polo grounds, next Saturday, won the title from Abe Attel in Vernon, California, in 1912, receiving the referee's decision after a 20-round engagament.

Then at the age of 21 and at the height of his career, Kilbane outfought the slipping Attell throughout the contest, blinding him with straight lefts to the face and an occasional right smash to paw and ribs. Attell endeavored to draw his young opponent into a close-quarter slugging match but the wily Kilbane stood off, boxing his way to fame.

Barely Saves Title.

In the following year Kilbane barely saved his title in a 20-round bee with Johnny Dundee, of Nev York, holding the little Italian to draw. Kilbane easily disposed of other pretenders to the featherweigh throne, but in 1917 he grew too am weight title from Benny Leonard. Leonard knocked out Kilbane in three rounds.

Kilbane has not defended his title in more than a year. In an indifferent exhibition against Freddy Jacks in Cleveland in 1921 he received the newspaper decision. Later he knocked out Danny Frush, an Englishman, in seven rounds. In 1922 he failed to don a glove, demanding all sorts of money for fighting. He repeatedly was challenged by Johnny Dundee, but refused to meet him unless his demands for large purses were met. Dundee Looms Up.


The New York boxing commission then declared Kilbane's title open in New York. Later Danny Frush and Johnny Dundee fought for it, and Frush being knocked out by the Italian veteran, Dundee was proclaimed champion, insofar as the New York commission was concerned. When Crikui came to the United States Dundee refused, at first, to relinquish his claim to the first engagement with a fight with the winner. Kilbane is a master boxer and a clever ringman. He has defeated ev ery featherweight of note excepting Dundee since he won the title. He was born in Cleveland of Irish-American parentage April 18, 1899.




