Ranger for some years to come. Should a greater capacity be needed, it could be cheaply obtained by adding more filter beds, Shaw said.

The installation of additional pump and engine with a capacity of 600,000 to 750,000 gallons per day, including the removal of present pumping equipment to new building, would cost \$8,000.

The installation of a 1,000,000-gallon filtration plant to be installed in connection with the present sedimentation tanks, and with sufficient space to house all pumping equipment would mean an outlay of \$25,000.

A 250,000-gallon steel or concrete reservoir complete on foundation would mean a cost of \$10,500 not including the site.

There would also be a cost of about 5 per cent for engineering and supervision, or \$3,460.
