

Germany To Ask For Loan To Feed Her Many Starving People

WASHINGTON, Dec. 5-The United States government has decided to support an appeal soon to be made by Germany for huge loans to be raised in the United States and Great Britain to feed the starving population in that country, it was learned at the state department today.

The German appeal is soon to be made to the reparations commission in Faris and Secretary Hughes is said to have instructed Col. James A. Logan, official American observer on the reparations commission, to support the German appeal when made. The maximum figure Germany will need, according to information received here, is 70 million dollars. One-half of this sum is to be raised in the United States and the remainder in Great Britain.
