Owing to the fine texture of human hair and the shortness of the strands, no machine has been invented that can knit from where the hair is first shipped to the United States to be dyed and made sanitary by chemical process. It is then returned for knitting into nets. The strands are tied end to end to form one long string. This is wound on a shuttle which is worked round a bamboo stick or bodkin. 
