## Some Weighty Reasons Why the Citizens of Ranger Should Buy and Own the Water Distributing System

Because it is a valuable franchise which will become more valuable as the city grows.

Because it may be bought on the credit of the City of Ranger without adding to the burden of the taxpayers, as the income from the water consumers will take care of all interest charges and also retire the bonds within a few years, after which the water plant will be a source of income for the city.

Because by installing a water filtering plant, one of the first things to be done, citizens may be supplied with pure water, fit for drinking, thus doing away with the necessity of buying drinking water, as at present.

Because the cost of water to consumers will be reduced from $\$ 1$ for each 1,000 gallons to 50 cents for each 1,000 gallons.

Because improvements to the pumping plant, larger mains, duplication of distributing pipes will reduce the insurance key rate, thus effecting an additional saving to property owners.

Because every city of any importance owns its water distributing system, has found it to be profitable and none would consider for an instant surrendering this valuable franchise to private interests.

Because cheaper water will enable the people to water their trees, flowers and lawns more freely and aid materially in transforming Ranger into the City Beautiful.

Because it is an opportune time to buy the Ranger water system, and never the time will come again, should this opportunity be lost, to buy the water distributing system so cheaply and on such advantageous terms as now.

Because not one adequate reason has been advanced why the taxpayers should not vote the bond issue of $\$ 190,000$ with which to buy and improve the water supply system.

So vote next Tuesday, January 15, for the bonds and ownership by the citizens of Ranger of their water distributing system.
