LAWS AND CRIMINALS.

Records compiled by the national industrial council indicate a nationwide frenzy to load up statute books with new laws. The 39 state legislatures which met this year enacted 13,018 new laws. North Carolina seems to head the list with 1,173. The Tennessee legislature added to the bewilderment of the citizens of that commonwealth by requiring com-pliance with 812 newly enacted statutes. Connecticut ranges in with 700. These states are all in excess of New York's record of 686 new laws. New York, however, meets annually instead of every two years and for comparative purposes should be credited with 1,355 new laws.

The last congress' added 289 private and 632 public acts for further muddling up a bad situation.






