When does the most mail come like" appearance. into Ranger during postoffice hours? Two o'clock in the afterncon, ac-tween the banquet tables. It is

cording to both Postmaster J. F. Dre-inhofer and Assistant Postmaster for the banquet, but they have not inhofer and Assistant Postmaster George A. Gray. Passenger train No. 8 of the Texas & Pacific railroad brings a heavy load of mail usually for this city, and its distribution be-gins around 2 o'clock, if the train is on time.

Monday is the busiest day of the bus, a background.

Monday is the busiest day of the week for the postoffice employes. On this day, folks who get their gen-eral delivery mail always call for it. On Sundays, first class mail only is sorted for the postoffice private box. es, and all other classes of mail must be taken care of Monday. Carriers, too, have two day's mail to deliver on Monday. More stamps are sold on Monday, more letters registered and more money orders issued. The smallest volume of business at the city postoffice comès on Wednes day. The most outgoing mail is hand-led on Monday. Sunday, with its opportunity of attending religious services and obtaining rest, is used by folks to catch up with their corres-pondence and this mail goes off Mon-day morning. Both rural and city

packages runs high. For example of Monday of this week, 101 parcel post packages were checked for delivery through the rented office boxes by Assistant Postmaster Gray. He also estimated that between 75 and 100 packages were delivered by city car-riers on the same day.

Clerks have to hustle between the hours of 7 and 9 a. m., each day, as the night incoming mail from three trains has to be shaped up for de-livery. The most slack hours of the day come between 12 and 2 o'clock day come between 12 and 2 o'clock, Gray said. This does not take into consideration the run of business at the windows, as this must necessarily vary.


NORTH CAROLINA TOBACCO.


