



Hot Weather Forms Ice in Coal Mine

During the summer, ice is mined from coal pit located in an eastern state. Cold air seeping through earth fissures in winter cools the rocks to a temperature far below freezing, but no ice forms because the atmosphere is too dry. At its depth the heat of summer cannot reach the vault. During warm months, the shaft becomes moist, and when coal was being dug there recently, it is said, the niners had to remove three or four carloads of ice every morning before they were able to get to their posts. As a result, the working was abandoned as a source of fuel, leaving it entirely free for use as a natural refrigerator. \* \* \*


