COURT CHARGES GRAND JURY ON RESPONSIBILIT

Suggests Campaign To Teach People How To Take Care Of Their Property.

By United Press.
CHICAGO. Dec. 7. — President tariff as an aid to the farmer, warned against government price fixing as a panacea for agricultural ills and lauded co-operative marketing.
Addressing the American Federation Farm Bureau, the president enumerated the steps by which he belives agriculture can be put on a sound and independent basis. This includes extension of storage facilities, co-operative marketing, information and advice from the agricultural department and farm loan bank credits. Without discussing many of these in detail, the President devoted most of his speech to exposing alleged falacies of government marketing panaceas and lauded the benefits from a protective tariff.

Leaders of the co-operative movement in the agricultural department have prepared a co-operative farm bill embodying his principles, he said. He opposed government co-operation which would directly fix prices by buying and selling because this would create a bureaucracy, detailed.




