

FORT WORTH, Feb. 9.—Dr. Fredrick A. Cook, Arctic explorer, who is serving a sentence of 14 years in Leavenworth on a charge of using the mails to defraud had filed application for a probation period of five years.

Dr. Cook is making his application under the provision of a law passed by Congress, March 4, 1925, giving the courts having the original jurisdiction in a criminal case, the right to place a defendant on probation not exceeding five years. Cook says that he is past 61 years old and would die in prison if he has to serve his entire term.






