TOKIO, Japan, Feb. 10.—One hundred and three persons have been killed in the prefectures of Igata, Toyana and Fukui where uprecedented snow falls have occurred during the last three days.

Johnson went on trial here Wednesday of last week on a charge of fatally shooting John Harris at Pioneer February 6. 1926. He was tried on the murder charge six months ago and found guilty, his punishment being assessed at six years in the penitentiary. The trial court's verdict was set aside in the court of criminal appeals which ordered retrial of the case.

Nary-Haugen farm relief measure is a good thing for the farmers of the middle west and northwest where grain is the leading crop. The authors forgot the south as they usually do in the republican stronghold states, and cotton is given but little consideration. It might be a good idea for the farmers of the south to help themselves and get out of the mire of debt, but doing a little more diversification in operations and using intensive methods which include fertilization of the soil and raise more food and feedstuff at home.

In giving help to the farmer, the south should not be forgotten. The cotton farmer needs aid as well as the other man. The products of the farms of the south practically clothe the world. However, the farmer who has his own pork barrel, and the farmer's wife who has a larder loaded with good canned vegetables, fruits and meats including chicken does not need any government help.

The farmer who has a can of cream to sell every day or two, and a few dozen eggs with a few fryers does not need much help from the government, he is independent.

If it were possible for the farmers of the south to lay off planting any cotton for a year, then they could control the market. However, such a

step is hardly thought of by them. There are many problems that the farmers of the south have to solve. On Feb. 17 and 18 several experts in their lines will help the farmers of Eastland and surrounding counties solve those problems. The lectures will be profusely illustrated with moving pictures. 

That the statuted with the self-based of the sel Corrupt officials are not unknown in British prisons, but they are rare. Only one official has been known to accept "money for favors" in the past five years. He was given a prison sentence.
Sailors Sought

Sailors are especially sought for as prison warders. Husky, rawboned naval men abound as officials in British prisons. For 'treating 'emrough and making 'em like it' no better type is known. Dissipling has better type is known. Discipline has permeated to their very bones, owing to their service in the navy, and they know how to hand it on to others. The bark of their voices is enough to put fear into the ordinary human keing. Let an "old lag" get tough with them and his days henceforth Roast meat is a luxury seldom dis

with them and his days henceforth are purgatory.

A British prison warden is nobody backed-up by the governor of the prison. According to high police officials, complaints by prisoners of ill-treatment are listened to, but that is about all. More often than not the complaintant is ordered preemptorily to return to his cell and told he is not in prison for the benefit of his health, but for exactly what he is complaining about. Also on occasions the governor looks on while a prisoner is being "beaten up," and seldom does he interfere.

Poor Food

Food given to prisoners is no more than sufficient to stay the pangs of hunger. It is not the most appetizing in the world. Vegetable soup forms a large part of the menu, as also does porridge—unsweetened.

Roast meat is a luxury seldom dispensed. Green vegetables rarely find their way to the prisoner's plate. Dry bread is given in comparatively liberal quantities to fill up. Weak, unsweetened tea, coffee and cocoa is the daily beverage.

The following is a typical break-fast in one of the British prisons:

Tea, a minute portion of syrup, two or three slices of dry bread, and a supply of salt. It will be noticed that butter is conspicuous by its absence. In this particular prison it came to the notice of the officials that prisoners had a tendency to spatter the butter about their cells.

The allowance was immendiately cut off and salt substituted. To make the bread palatable prisoners now smear it with salt. Hard, true, but it was found that abuse of food ceased.



Prisoners occasionally sham illness to avoid uncongenial tasks. Their treatment is drastic. When it is absolutely established that prisoner is feigning sickness he is given prison sick diet. For breakfast a bowl of weak tea, two slices of dry bread and salt. Dinner consists of coffee, dry bread and what is known in prison parlance as 'shadow soup.' This con-sists of a bowl of hot water into which a teaspoonfull of melted fat is added—no more than sufficient to give the water a greasy appearance. The evening meal is precisely the same as breakfast, except that cocoa is substituted for tea. Generally four days of this treatment is sufficient to have the prisoner begging to return to work, no matter of what description. Nevertheless, he is kept on "sick diet" for ten days. Prison officials state that this is an infallible cure for laziness. Prisoners with the most evil of reputations rarely if ever desire the dose repeated. State boarding is no pleasure

LONDON.—A criminal's first days

Three times a day he hears another—when his food is handed to him through the bars of his cell. He cannot pierce the impenetrable gloom of his first habitation in prison—the "dark cell."

From there he is assigned to working gang. Usually, the tasks alloted to a new comer are laborious inconstonous heartbreaking. Pickaxe and shovel are given him. If the prisoner has led a sedentary, refined life, so much the worse for him. Upon his conduct with this gang depends whether his work eventually is made easier.

The working hours are not long. The morning period is from 8 to 12 noom. The afternoon shift from 1:30 to 5. But there is no let up. Jailers, atmed with rifles in addition to a "sap"—a solid rubber truncheon-hanging from the trover-belt, watch the gang with alertness. Any slacking is the signal for bringing the "sap" into play. British jailers are not gentle. Complete silence among prisoners is insisted upon. The penalty for an offense against this prison law is three days solitary confinement in the "dark cell" on breadend water.




