





HIGHER COURT AFFIRMS **RISING STAR VICTORY**

The supreme court of Texas has affirmed the judgment of the court of civil appeals in the suit originally brought by the city of Rising Star against J. M. Dill, decided against the defendant and appealed by him. The suit was a test case to determine the right of taxpayers in Rising Star to resist payment of taxes on the ground that Rising Star had no lawful right to make such a tax levy and the taxes were unlawiung assessed. Joe F. Orr and Marshail McCullough of Eastland were the attorneys for Rising Star.
